CONVENTION OF TEACHERS.

Arrangements Nearly Completed for Their Entertainment in Pendleton.

The committee who have charge of the arranging for the meeting of the Inland Empire Teachers' Association which meets in Pendleton on the 22d of the present month have gotten their plans in shape, the program arranged, and there now remains but little to be accomplished before the convention.

A very large attendance is expected and all arrangements have been made for their care and entertainment. As it would be impossible to quarter all the visitors at the hotels, arrangements have been made to care for them at private homes throughout the city. County Superintendent Nowlin informed the East Oregonian that he is being taken in the coming convention of teachers and educators by the people of Pendleton. Numbers have expressed their willingness to assist to any extent in their power and have kindly consented to throw open their homes for the entertainment of the visitors. The women's club of the city have taken hold of the affair and will give their aid towards the success of the meeting. Many prominent educators throughout Oregon, Washington and Idaho will come and many able addresses and lectures will be heard. The superintendent has just issued a circular letter, of which the following is a copy, and is mailing them all over the country to teachers and educators:

Pendleton, Or., March 12, 1900.—You are earnestly entreated to make the necessary arrangements so that you can attend the meeting of the Inland Empire Teachers' Association, which meets in Pendleton on the 22d of this month. You cannot afford to miss it. It is the first meeting of the association held in this country; the representative teachers of three states will be present; the program has been arranged with much care, and men and women of culture and educational ability will entertain and instruct you. We desire every teacher in the county to be present at this convention if it is possible.

Teachers who are engaged in teaching will do well to consult with their school boards and get their consent to a two days' vacation, and the boards are requested, not only to give the vacation but to allow the teachers' pay to continue during the time, as every district will be a ten-fold gainer by such an arrangement. Teachers cannot attend such a meeting without going away benefited and filled with a renewed desire to attain the heights of excellence in their profession. There is an enthusiasm and inspiration evolved from such a convention that is contagious and imparts itself to every participant.

THE MARKETS.

No Improvement in the Wheat Situation—Cattle Market Lower.

Portland, March 15.—The Commercial, in its review for the week, says in its issue of today: The wheat market during the past week offered very little encouragement to holders, and exporters are apparently doing nothing. One vessel remains at the loading, and will probably finish this week. On the Sound, two are loading, and the fact fully bears out the assertion repeatedly made in these columns, that exporters had plenty of wheat for all tonnage, as vessels arriving here have been given quick dispatch. The warehouses at tidewater are all filled with wheat for ships nearly due, and the prospect for shipments the balance of the season is very poor. Our route list is very large, but the greater part of the same is for next season's loading. Stocks in the country are very large, and nearly 15,000,000 bushels of wheat still remain to come to tidewater. Foreign markets show little improvement, and at present writing it is difficult to obtain a satisfactory bid for prompt shipment cargoes, hence exporters are doing nothing, and waiting on the coast for a better market. Some sales are going on constantly, but mostly in small parcels, by holders who have become tired and desire to realize on wheat they have. The present dullness is entirely due to a scarcity of sellers, or, rather, to cheap wheat prices, which buyers at full market values to be found at all times, but they do not propose to pay extreme fancy prices, simply to do something, and until such time as a change comes over the spirit of holders no activity can be expected. It is no use in talking the encouragement of higher prices for wheat; it seems to be very remote, and, barring serious harm to the growing crops, there is not much of a prospect for any activity. Any rallies that have or may occur will be in the nature of natural ones, namely, by the speculative taking of profits by the short seller. Quotations are: For club wheat, shipping purposes, 53 to 54c; Valley, 53c; and bluestem, 56c. Milling wheat is quoted at about the same figure, although some of the smaller mills experience trouble in securing choice stock and are paying a premium above these figures.

Wheat in San Francisco.
Portland, March 15.—The market has ruled dull, to an easing off in values. Exporters are not encouraged to work new trades, and are paying most attention to getting tonnage on berth loaded and cleared up. The steady decline in cable bids for forward shipments has made the shipping interests cautious about taking up new business, consequently transactions have been on a limited scale. Formerly it was thought that \$1 per cent. for California wheat was a low price, but even lower prices were reached during the week. Perhaps 90c per cent is now a full figure, and, while the market is nominally quoted at that figure, exporters do not evince any lively disposition to operate on the basis of that quotation, being afraid that before the wheat is floated another drop in Europe will wipe out all prospective profits. Holders are reported to be offering with comparative freedom, but the difficulty in securing firm offers for prompt shipment is largely responsible for the present inactive condition of the local grain trade. Quotations are: No. 1 shipping, 90c; milling, 81c; Oregon wheat, 90 to 90c per cent.

The Grain Supply.
New York, March 15.—Broadstreet's reports the following change for the week in the wheat supply:

Wheat, United States and Canada, east of the Rockies, decrease, 1,625,000 bushels; total supply, decrease, 15,000 bushels.

The aggregate stocks of wheat held at Portland, Tacoma and Seattle decreased 109,000 bushels last week.

Wool in Boston.
Boston, March 15.—The market continues quiet with quotations unchanged. Territory wools continue to be quoted at about 60c, scored, for choice lots of fine medium and medium, with staple lots higher. Fine fleeces are quiet and nominal in price. Australian wools are scarce and prices nominal.
