ATHENA'S CITY GOVERNMENT.

Does Not Owe a Cent and Has Money in the Bank.

There are probably few city governments in Oregon which have been conducted as has that of Athena. The business of the city has been conducted upon such economical principles that not one cent of debt is owed and there is \$1708.73 to the city's credit on deposit in the First National bank of that place. This was told to an East Oregonian reporter Friday by Attorney T. G. Hailey, who had just returned from a professional visit to that place. Mr. Hailey was enthusiastic in his praise of the manner in which the city officers conduct their business and said they all united on a platform of retrenchment and reform. Considerable work is being done on the streets this spring and Athena is steadily advancing.

Mr. Hailey said that the crops throughout that section were all looking fine and farmers were all busy looking after the same. "This causes Athena to be rather quiet," he said, "but throughout the country there is plenty of work going on and one cannot help but notice the general air of prosperity and activity that exists."

"Politics pervades the atmosphere everywhere, and is the general theme of conversation. Athena has produced an unusually large number of candidates for office this season, and they tell me that only about one-half of the political bosses under their hats have yet announced themselves. That part of the county has lately been visited by various candidates from Pendleton and they have been the cause, to a great extent, of the present state of affairs."

THE WORK OF THE CENSUS.

The Supervisor for the Second District Considering Fitness of Applicants.

The supervisor of the census for the Second district of Oregon is now considering the fitness of the various applicants for appointments as enumerators. The qualifications are set forth in a circular from the director of the census, from which the following extract is taken: "The appointment of enumerators will be made with reference to physical activity and to aptness, neatness, and accuracy in writing and in the use of figures. The census requires active, energetic persons of good address and readiness with the pen. Only such can do the work with satisfaction to the government or profit to themselves."

Each applicant is given a specimen blank, or test sheet, with complete instructions for filling it out. He is also given a "narrative" supposed to contain the facts likely to be gathered in a day's canvass. He is required to place this narrative on the test sheet. This blank is examined by the supervisor, and if it comes up to the required standard, the applicant is listed for appointment. This list, with the application and test sheet, will be forwarded to the director of the census at Washington for final approval. The candidate must certify that the handwriting is his own, and that he has received no assistance in filling out the schedule. The officials of the census are not allowed to render any assistance. No one will be appointed who is not thoroughly qualified for the work.

IT WAS SUICIDE.

Sheriff Blakley Says There is No Question but That Joseph Killed Himself.

The officers who went to Athena Friday to the scene of the suicide of Henry Joseph, returned on the evening train. Sheriff Blakley was seen this morning and stated that the report of the suicide as published in the daily East Oregonian was substantially correct, with the exception as to where the suicide occurred. Joseph ended his life at the farm of D. Reed, 12 miles from Athena, near Reservation mountain. According to Mr. Reed's story, as reported by Sheriff Blakley, he and his wife left home early Thursday morning by team to visit friends, expecting to be gone the greater part of the day. Joseph, who has been stopping with them for some time, was in bed when they left. He was called by Mrs. Reed, but refused to get up, stating that he did not feel well. Mrs. Reed told him that he was going away and would probably not return until late in the afternoon. Joseph replied that he would take care of himself and Mr. and Mrs. Reed left him. This was the last time that he was seen alive.

It appears that after the departure of Mr. and Mrs. Reed Joseph got up from bed, cooked himself breakfast, washed the dishes and put everything in order. It seems that he then went out and did a little work. He then returned to the house, removed his shoes and socks, took down a large calibre buffalo rifle and went back to his small kitchen in the rear of the house. Here he seated himself, placed the muzzle against his forehead with his right hand, and with the toes of his right foot pushed the trigger.

Sheriff Blakley stated that from the position the body was found in there can be no question but that this was the manner in which he ended his life. On searching the body a razor was discovered in the dead man's pocket. Mrs. Reed stated, when the razor was shown her, that it belonged to her husband and that she had given it to him. She said that she saw it in the bottom of her trunk. It would seem from this that Joseph evidently had intentions of suicide and contemplated ending his life with the razor, but on seeing the gun changed his mind.

No jury was empaneled, as the facts were so clear that it was not thought necessary. Joseph's eyebrows were burnt off and the hand in which he held the muzzle of the gun was badly burned with powder. Those who saw the body say it was one of the most horrible sights they ever witnessed. From the eyes up the entire top of the head was blown off and nothing remained in it except the eyeballs, which had fallen on the inside of the head.

Joseph has a sister in Pendleton by the name of Mrs. Wilson, who lives on Court street opposite the court house. She was at the sheriff's office this morning to learn what disposition had been made of the body. She contemplated going to Athena today to see that the remains were properly interred, but was turned back by the Athena official that the body had been buried Friday evening.

TROUT FOR OUR STREAMS.

Twenty-five Thousand Will Be Planted in the Near Future.

The recent action of the anglers of Pendleton in regard to stocking the streams of this county with trout has commenced to bear fruit, as will be observed by the following letter received Friday by J. E. Krause from A. E. Gebhart, secretary of the Oregon fish and game association. Since the meeting held by the anglers in Pendleton last week, Mr. Krause responded with the state association requesting aid in securing the desired fish for stocking purposes and in reply received the following:

Portland, Or., March 15, 1900.

J. E. Krause, Director of Unatilla District, Oregon.

Since writing to you I have received a communication from one of the officers of the United States Fish Commission, in which he promises to grant us the favor we ask of supplying certain species of trout in your vicinity. If any trout are planted at this time, they will have to be rainbow trout as it will be impossible for the commission to furnish any brook trout until the fall of this year. We shall have some difficulty in getting even the rainbow trout and may have to import some from California.

I wish you would let me know at once in what streams in your vicinity the trout should be planted. Give me the names of two good creeks.

J. N. Teal, president of the association, also corroborated the statement of Gebhart, stating that he would do all in his power to have the request of the Pendleton anglers granted. That he was successful can be seen by the foregoing letter.

Mr. Krause was asked by the East Oregonian what stream was being suggested for the planting of the fish and he stated that the anglers would request that the greater part would be placed near the North Fork of Meacham creek. Some 25,000 will be supplied at this time and it is also desired that some of those be placed in McKay creek above what is known as the Big Bend. Mr. Krause said that the government had promised to plant some 100,000 in this county, but were unable to furnish more than 25,000 at this time. The others will be sent at some future date and that many are placed in the streams of this county it is estimated that the supply will keep the streams alive with trout for years to come. As there are many preliminary matters to receive attention in the matter, Mr. Krause was unable to say at what date the fish would be planted, but says the fish commissioner may arrive at any time.
