TAXES ARE NOW DUE.

Bills for 1899 Delivered to the Sheriff by the County Clerk.

County Clerk B. S. Burroughs has delivered to Sheriff W. M. Blakley the tax rolls for 1899, the taxes of the assessment for that year being now due. According to the order of the county court, the taxes will become due May 9. The total amount carried by the rolls in \$160,805.19, divided as follows: County and state tax \$117,258.53; Polls, \$1,124; Road poll tax, \$3192; Road tax, \$6889.03; Coyote bounty tax, \$1722.23; Coyote bounty tax on sheep, \$1576.96; City of Pendleton, \$7323.18; City of Milton, \$196.52; City of Weston, \$488.02; City of Athena, \$538.02.

COLUMBIA SOUTHERN AT WORK.

Has Five Hundred Men Laying Track to Shaniko.
E. E. Lytle, of the Columbia Southern, has stated that his company now has 500 men at work laying track. They are progressing at the rate of 4500 to 5000 feet per day. "We expect to have our line completed through to Shaniko by April 15," said he. "Commencing May 1, we shall establish passenger train service between Biggs, on the O. R. & N., and Shaniko. Our train will connect with the new O. R. & N.'s morning train, to be put into service on or about that date, running out of Portland. This will enable mail to reach interior districts 24 hours earlier than at present from the Dalles. It will shorten the old route from The Dalles to intermediate points 60 miles, displacing stage lines to that extent. Daily stages will be put on at Shaniko to Prineville and intermediate points, via Canyon City. "Our company will establish its repair shops at Shaniko. We have had drawn already the plans and specifications for a passenger depot and freight house."
"We believe that our line is opening up territory directly tributary to Portland—a territory rich in mineral resources and a great country as well. Trade that would naturally drift southward, providing facilities were afforded, will certainly come to Portland. There are rich mines along the John Day river where ore is now accumulating that will go to Tacoma and San Francisco. Just as soon as Portland establishes its proposed smelter, this will all go there. It will then be possible to make a rate as low as \$2.

A POLITICAL DAY.

Republican Primaries Are in Progress in Umatilla County.

Today, the first real battle of the republican campaign has been in progress, and, in fact is not yet ended, for the primaries are being conducted throughout Umatilla county by that party. Although there have been no many open expressions indicative of contention between factions, anyone who has for a moment turned aside from his business and inquired into the local political conditions has quickly learned that Umatilla county republicans are fiercely fighting just now, fighting very fiercely.

The publication of his open letter to Sixth district republican voters by Judge Lowell last week was the best criterion by which to judge the trend of events. So soon as the letter appeared, it became apparent that there was a Lowell and anti-Lowell contest waging, and that the primaries and county conventions would center around that issue as the one paramount issue.

It is generally understood that the interests which are opposing Judge Lowell have also declared war on Senator Taylor. This is a fact not denied, and, in truth, the supremacy of Judge Lowell and Senator Taylor for of the opposing elements, is the issue which interests republican voters today.

It is also true that the head and front of the anti-Lowell element is W. J. Furnish, who, with some other strong republicans about him has organized the battle. The Mr. Furnish commands the forces is conceded.

The republican primaries today have, therefore, been intensely interesting, not only to republicans, but as well to democrats. For it has been a struggle to control the machinery of the party in this county.

The primaries opened at 1 o'clock, and will close at 6 p. m. Tomorrow, the delegates will be known and observing persons will be able to judge somewhat how went the battle of the preliminary ballots in today's contest.

Tuesday evening, the democrats met at the court house to arrange for the coming of W. J. Bryan on Thursday, March 29. Committees were appointed to attend to the various details as follows:

Committee on grounds—T. F. Howard, to name his assistants.

T. G. Hailey was appointed to send someone throughout the county to give notice of Mr. Bryan's coming by personally visiting the several towns in the county and advertising the rally.

W. M. Pierce will serve as chairman of the day and as chairman of the reception committee. The reception committee will consist of twenty-four members, and the vice-presidents will be appointed one from each precinct of the county. The names will be announced tomorrow.

Removes Fleeces from 5000 Bucks and Ewes Before Lambing Begins.

R. T. Cox came in Tuesday from Charles Cunningham's ranch, where he had been for several days. Mr. Cox states that Mr. Cunningham has already sheared 5000 sheep, his thoroughbred bucks and two bands of thoroughbred ewes, although lambing has not yet begun. The shearing of sheep this early, almost two months before the time at which shearing usually begins, is quite unprecedented in this county. It is to be doubted if it has been done heretofore by any sheepman.

The weather had prevailed so warm and the sheep were carrying such heavy fleeces that it was thought by Mr. Cunningham to be advisable to remove the wool thus early.

Mr. Cox says that the fleeces are well grown and clean, being very large and heavy in spite of the fact that they were removed almost two months early and therefore had but only ten months' time in which to grow. The staple is first class, having grown steadily throughout the winter with no severe spells to cause breaks in the fibre.

Lambing will generally begin soon, some bands having already begun.

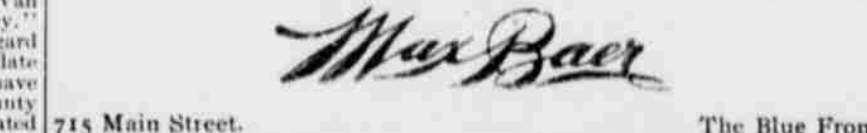
CHARMING BELLE ARCHER.
