Mrs. Chas. H. Miller is visiting her sister, Mrs. F. W. Hendley, at Pendleton.

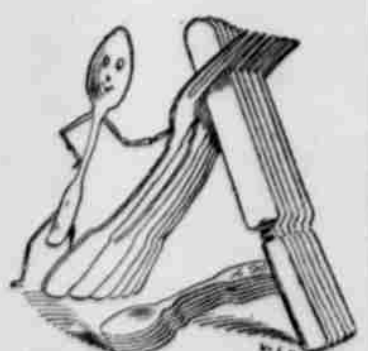

POPULISTS' JUDICIAL TICKET.

Delegates at Portland Fail to Agree for Umatilla and Morrow.

R. J. Slater for judge of the Sixth judicial district, and J. T. Hinkle for district attorney, is the populist ticket in Umatilla and Morrow counties. The fusion arrangement which was effected at Portland on the state and congressional tickets failed when the Sixth judicial district nominations came on, and hence the democratic nominations of A. D. Stillman for judge and T. G. Bailey for district attorney stand, and the populist nominations of Slater and Hinkle were made.

The Sixth judicial district was the only one in which the fusion arrangement failed. The democratic and populist conference committees agreed on this report as to division of offices:

We have agreed upon the following distribution of candidates to be nominated by the respective parties:

First—Justice of the supreme court by the democrats.

Second—First congressional district by the democrats.

Third—Second congressional district by the people's party. Fourth—Food commissioner by the people's party.

Fifth—Presidential electors, two by the democratic party and two by the people's party.

It is also recommended that the joint delegation of the democratic, populist, representative and judicial district electors to the state of Oregon meet in joint convention of both parties and select candidates for the various offices as follows:

First—Nomination for district attorney for the first judicial district, by the democratic party.

Second—Nomination for district attorney in the second judicial district by the democratic party.

Third—Nomination for district attorney in the third judicial district by the people's party.

Fourth—Nomination for district attorney in the fourth judicial district by the democratic party.

Fifth—Nomination for district attorney in the fifth judicial district by the people's party.

Sixth—Nominations in the sixth judicial district to be equally divided between the two parties.

Seventh—In the seventh judicial district it is recommended that the selection of a candidate for district attorney be made in a joint convention of all delegates of both parties from said district.

Eighth—Nomination of district attorney for the eighth judicial district to be made by the democratic party.

Ninth—Nomination for district attorney in the ninth judicial district to be made by the people's party.

We recommend that the selection of candidates for judges and representatives be made by the delegates of their respective districts of both parties in joint convention.

We would also recommend that the nomination for the several judicial districts be made as herein set forth, except that in districts where said nomination shall be made by the delegates, then, in that event, the said nomination shall be made by the joint convention of such districts separately by a fair and equitable distribution, to be determined by said joint district conventions. The nominations of one convention are to be ratified by the other.

In this district, the joint arrangement was not acceptable, hence the nomination of two tickets.

Democratic National Delegates.

The state democratic convention selected as delegates to the national convention—J. H. Haley, of Pendleton; J. O. Booth, of Josephine; M. A. Miller, of Lebanon; A. S. Bennett, of The Dalles; Dr. John Welch, of Portland; R. M. Veatch, of Colgate Grove; Charles Nickell, of Jacksonville; N. A. Perry, of Multnomah.

Alternates—J. D. McKinnon, of La Grande; A. J. Knott, of Portland; F. Butler, of Baker City; Jefferson Myers, of Salem; H. Taylor Hill, of Crook county; Dan J. Fry, of Salem; Charles N. Wait, of Canby; E. E. Wilson, of Corvallis.

Two Trains Daily.

The Double Train Service in Effect on the O. R. & N. on and After April 22.

The double train service to be established between Portland and Chicago April 22, in which the O. R. & N. Union Pacific and the Oregon Short Line are interested, will shorten the through time 11 hours.

Train No. 2 leaving Portland at 9:15 a. m., beginning on the date named, will be known as the Chicago-Portland special. Its equipment will be new, and it will be a first-class train.

It will consist of a mail-car, baggage-car, a library-composite car, a first-class Pullman sleeper, a dining-car, two chair cars, and a tourist sleeper. There will be but one change at all Eastern points.

The full time will be three days through to Chicago, or four days and two hours to New York.

The second train, known as No. 6, will leave Portland at 6:20 p. m., connecting at East Portland, with the Southern Pacific's evening train from San Francisco, and will carry through equipment to Chicago via the Union Pacific and the Chicago & Northwest, and also the equipment for the Washington division of the O. R. & N., in connection with the Great Northern for St. Paul. This train will reach Spokane at 10 a. m. A dining car will be furnished for breakfast into Spokane, and for dinner on corresponding train leaving Spokane at 3:45 p. m. The new schedule as arranged, will supply the most complete service ever furnished on the O. R. & N., as it provides increased service in Eastern Oregon, where it is greatly needed, and gives immediate connection with the Washington division at Pendleton.

At this point there is a large interchange of traffic, on account of the various mining districts of Baker county, the Coeur d'Alene, the Republic and Kootenai mining camps. Portland is greatly benefited by this change, inasmuch as increased service is given from Eastern Oregon and Idaho.

No. 2 will arrive in Chicago in 9:30 a. m. No. 6 will arrive at 7:45 a. m., as at present.

The westbound train out of Chicago, corresponding with the eastbound No. 6, is No. 3 out of Chicago. This will reach Portland at 7:30 a. m. Westbound train No. 1 will leave Chicago at 6:30 p. m., and Omaha at 8:20 a. m. the following day. The time will be reduced two hours and 45 minutes.

No. 3 westbound train will leave Chicago at 10:30 p. m., and Omaha at 4:25 p. m. the next day.

The service on the Union Pacific on all these trains include buffet-smoking-library cars, and dining cars. No. 6 will carry a daily ordinary sleeper to Kansas City, with change en route to ordinary cars to Chicago.

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TO TAX STATE LANDS.

The County Assessor of Marion Will Make the State Pay Taxes.

County Assessor J. W. Hobart, of Marion county, says that he will this year include in his assessment roll all property in Marion county owned by the state, land board and acquired by the board through the foreclosure of mortgages or by deeds. It has been the custom up to this time not to assess property of this kind for the reason that it is considered exempt under the laws regarding taxation. The statute governing the subject is found in chapter 17 of Hill's Code, Section 2729 reads:

"All taxes for the support of the government of this state shall be assessed on property in equal and ratable proportion, and all property, real and personal, within this state, not expressly exempted therefrom, shall be subject to taxation in the manner provided by law."

Section 2732 provides what property shall be exempt. The first two classes are:

"1. All property, real and personal, of the United States and of this state.

"2. All public or corporate property of the several counties, cities, villages, towns and school districts in this state, used or intended for corporate purposes."

Mr. Hobart is of the opinion that while lands owned by the state and occupied by the state institutions are properly omitted from the assessment roll, it is not proper that the best farm lands of the county should be exempt because owned by the state land board. The land that Mr. Hobart acquires through having made a loan, taking a mortgage as security and subsequently being compelled to take the land through default in the payment of the money. Of late years, the board has become the owner of many valuable farms and some good city property in this manner. The land now owned by the board in this county and acquired through loans has cost the board in the aggregate \$44,000.

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
