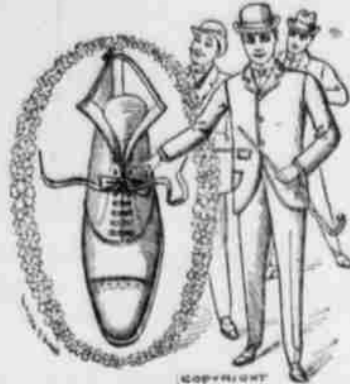

Rev. A. Y. Skew, of Spokane, delivered the sermon on Wednesday evening, and Rev. Frank C. Atkins preached this morning at 10 o'clock. This evening, Rev. Mr. Green will preach before the conference.
