CROP GOVERNMENT REPORT.

Figures from Washington Show the Growing Grain in Fine Condition.

A. Ruppe, who makes the government reports to the department of the interior from this county, has received the monthly report from Washington of the conditions affecting the growing crop in the United States, given by states. The totals and averages constitute a bear feature on the wheat market, as the condition of the crop is such as to indicate a big acreage and a big yield.

For Oregon, the report shows the first of prospects, the figure being:

Oregon—Present acreage compared with acreage sown last fall, 98.1 per cent.

Present acreage compared with acreage harvested last year, 111.5 per cent.

Average condition on May 1, 101 per cent.

Winter rye, average condition May 1, 102 per cent.

Meadow, mowing lands, average condition May 1, 103 per cent.

Spring pasture, average condition May 1, 107 per cent.

Spring plowing, proportion already done on May 1, 84 per cent.
