**THE GOOD CITIZEN,**

Dr. Penrose, of Whitman College, Speaks  
Before the Endeavor Convention.

Dr. S. B. L. Penrose, president of Whitman college, lectured before the Christian Endeavor convention Saturday evening. His subject was "A Roman Citizen," and from the citizenship of the Roman, as shown by the lecturer, he drew lessons for the citizens of the American republic. The address was practical, and could well have been heard by every person who has aught to do with the conduct of governmental or public affairs in this country.

One feature of the address was especially striking and was applicable to present conditions in this western country. "The good citizen pays his taxes promptly," said Dr. Penrose, "and is proud to do so. He never shirks this duty to the state, performs it willingly and does not wait until forced to pay them or lose his property."

Many other valuable suggestions were given. Dr. Penrose's lecture was heard by an audience that filled the Congregational church, and everyone who was there went away with words of hearty praise for the fine effort of the speaker.

SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND FISH.

That Many Fry to Arrive Here Wednesday Morning.

Seventy-five thousand fish fry will be brought to Pendleton on Wednesday morning from the Clackamas hatchery. They will be placed in the streams near here for propagation. The superintendent of the hatchery will accompany and distribute them among the creeks, 25,000 rainbow trout and 50,000 grayling to streams along 60 miles in North Fork of the Deschutes River in Pearson Creek, Latkes, 15,000 or 20,000 more will be placed in upper McKay creek.

E. E. Gedrich, Secretary of the Oregon Fish and Game Association of Portland, has been instrumental in protecting the young fish for these Eastern Oregon streams and proposes to get more, if possible.
