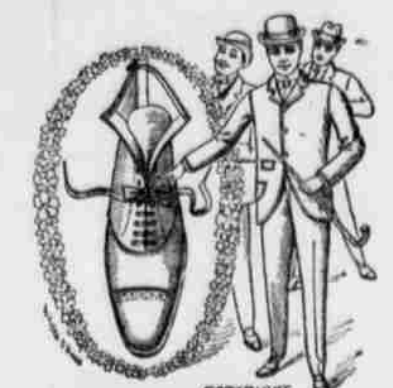

DEMOCRATIC SPEAKING TONIGHT.

William Smith, Candidate for Congress, and Other Nominees at Court House.

At 8 o'clock this evening, in the court room, Senator William Smith, of Baker City, union nominee for congress from the Second district, and other candidates will address the voters.

The meeting will be the closing rally of the campaign in this county. Mr. Smith has made an active canvass of the district, delivering twenty speeches, and at every place he has been well received.

At the last meeting held in Portland, Senator Smith was introduced by L. B. Cox, who four years ago was not with the regular democratic ticket, but supported the opposition. Mr. Cox made a statement to a large audience in the Metropolitan theater in that city, which has become a feature of the campaign in Multnomah county, and is said by men of conservative judgment to be good for 500 votes in that county, indicating, as it does, that the democrats who were out of line four years ago, or many of them, are lined up this year for the democratic nominees.

The candidates who are in Weston today will all arrive in Pendleton on the evening train, and the meeting will be full of enthusiasm.
