ELECTION IN UMATILLA. [CONCLUDED.] Reservation, 3; McKay, 4; Fulton, 2; Union, 2; total, 30. Rayburn—North Pendleton, 75; East Pendleton, 58; South Pendleton, 33; Reservation, 51; McKay, 56; Fulton, 33; Union, 29; total, 355. Wells—North Pendleton, 75; East Pendleton, 77; South Pendleton, 63; Reservation, 52; McKay, 40; Fulton, 15; Union, 21; total, 325. Peobler and Halley Elected. Just before going to press, the figures show that Peobler is elected by 20 majority. Returns from Morrow county also indicate Halley's election by 76 in the district, Umatilla and Morrow. His majority in Morrow is 26 and it is practically settled that he will have enough to keep the majority in Umatilla. STATE IS REPUBLICAN. Candidates for Supreme Court and Food Commissioner Have from 8000 to 10,000 Majority. Portland, June 5.—Incomplete returns from the state up to noon today indicate the election of Wolverson, republican, supreme judge, and Bailey, republican, food and dairy commissioner, by 8000 to 10,000 majority. In the first district Tongue, republican for congress, will have from 1300 to 2000 majority. In the second district Mosby, republican for congress, was elected by about 8000 majority. The democrats claim the entire fusion legislative ticket in Multnomah county is elected. If this holds good, the republican majority in the legislature will probably be 10 or 11. Rowe Leading for Mayor. In Portland the majority contest is very close with Rowe, republican, leading. FUSIONIST VICTORY IN PORTLAND. Four State Senators and Representatives Elected. Portland, Ore., June 5.—At 2 o'clock this afternoon Rowe, republican, for mayor, was 150 votes ahead of Storey, independent, and republicans claim that Rowe is elected without doubt. All of the remainder of the republican city ticket is elected. The entire republican county ticket is elected with the exception of the legislative ticket. The fusionists elect the four state senators and probably most of the 12 representatives, but the vote on representatives is so close that it will take complete returns to determine the result. George E. Chamberlain, democrat, for district attorney has a chance of election over R. E. Sewall, republican. RESULT IN UNION COUNTY. The Democrats Are Victorious in that County. La Grande, June 5.—The democratic and people candidates for the legislature in Union county are elected by fair majorities. Wade, for joint senator, for Union and Walla-walla counties, will have a majority of 20 over Church, republican. G. S. Reavis, for joint representative, and D. A. McAllister, for representative, are both elected, over republican opponents. By 10 to 200. On the county ticket the democrats elect Benson, clerk; Braag, school superintendent; George Brown, commissioner; republicans elect, Ben Brown, assessor; Fraxley, treasurer; and Henry, coroner. The sheriff is still in doubt. Sam White, democrat, has a big majority for prosecuting attorney. MORROW COUNTY'S VOTE. Halley Carries the County by 26 Votes for Prosecuting Attorney. Heppner, Ore., June 5.—Full returns from Morrow county give Halley, for circuit judge, 708; Stillman, 403; Fees for prosecuting attorney, 533; Halley, 501. Woolery's majority for joint senator, is 100. The returns show an increased republican majority in this county. BAKER COUNTY. Sam White, Prosecuting Attorney Carries the County and is Elected. Baker City, Ore., June 5.—A heavy vote was cast in this county and a number of precincts are yet to be heard from. White, democrat, district attorney, carries Baker by 400, and Union by 200, and is elected. The democrats elect a representative, recorder, assessor and school superintendent. The republicans elect the sheriff, clerk, treasurer, surveyor and coroner. The commissioner is in doubt. Smith, democrat, for congress, carries the county by about 160 majority over Mosby.
