The beaten and outraged Boers can find a home in this country. They have proven that they are capable of appreciating American citizenship by their bravery on the battlefield. Lowell said that America kept an open door for all mankind in the following eloquent words:

The governor of Arkansas tenters five millions of acres of state and government lands, within the boundaries of that commonwealth, for settlement by the defeated Boers if they will come to America. It is the chief glory of our great republic that it has always offered a refuge for the oppressed of all nations and tongues. There is no European race or nationality whose sons and daughters, hunted, trampled down and proscribed in the hands of their birth, have not found an asylum here. And why not? This is still the home of the free and the brave.

The public are informed that Senator Forsaker, of Ohio, will place William McKinley in nomination for a second term at Philadelphia this month. In this connection it is to be observed that Senator Forsaker, in his capacity as counsel for the Ping Tobacco Trust, at Columbus, Ohio, the other day, not only spoke kindly of that particular monopoly but in the course of an eloquent address covered trusts generally with eulogistic "flowers of speech." He described them as necessary agencies in the development of our foreign trade, and spoke scornfully of the fact that they had thrown thousands of men out of employment. He admitted that to be true, but said it was "a mere incident in the great industrial and commercial evolution in which the trusts are a step." It would be well for Senator Forsaker to include some of these sentiments in his speech, nominating McKinley.

It costs from one to four per cent. to collect the ordinary state and federal taxes. In New York to collect the state inheritance tax cost is twelve per cent. For collecting a little more than \$2,500,000 in that state the county treasurer's fees were \$67,000, the appraiser's fees \$84,000 and the lawyer's fees \$134,000. The New York papers are calling for the abolition of this extortion on the part of the fee grabbers. Laws are frequently enacted to take money out of the pockets of one class to put it in those of another. Man-made-law more frequently favors the few than it benefits the many. Instead of making more laws it would be better to repeal many of those that we have. There is more benefit to the people in de-legislation than in legislation; but it will be a long time before the people discover this truth, and if they did discover it, the fee grabbers might find their occupation gone. It is only upon the strongest oak tree that the best nourished parasite is found.

The republicans in congress, by making an effort to secure an anti-trust constitutional amendment, hoped to place the democrats on the defensive, during the presidential campaign on the trust issue, which the democrats will make one of the trinity of leading issues, with which to assail the administration. Littlefield and other republican members tried to make clear the fact that a constitutional amendment, empowering congress to control trusts and define them, is the most effective and immediate legislation with which to grapple with harmful monopolies, but it does appear as if the republicans were begging the question and for time, for it is plain that they are cognizant that the trust issue

is up to them and that the country holds them largely responsible for its creation, as well as for the evils it has inflicted upon the people. By proposing a constitutional amendment they hope to escape some of the responsibility and blame, and at the same time lose none of the trust pie.

EQUALITY OF OPPORTUNITY.
At Toledo, Ohio, last week, William J. Bryan gave utterance to words of patriotic sentiment, words that should burn into the hearts of all Americans. He said he was animated by a higher purpose than to attain to the presidency, that he had a son and daughter, and that he desired that his son and daughter-in-law should enjoy the rights and privileges of freedom and live under a government which afforded them equal opportunities in the race for life with all others, that the animating and controlling purpose of his efforts was to preserve the government founded by the fathers in its purity under which each individual will be free to work out his own salvation unimpeded and unhindered by monopolies that, unless crushed, will close all avenues of advancement to the young men and young women of America.

In giving utterance to such lofty and patriotic sentiments Mr. Bryan demonstrates that he realizes the tremendous responsibility that rests upon this generation and that in comparison with the faithful discharge of the obligations that impose more personal aggrandizement, no matter how great it may be, sinks into insignificance and becomes unworthy of any man.

The present is the connecting link between the past and the future. We of the present hold in trust for the future all the achievements of those who have gone before us. It is the duty and the desire of every patriot to receive the best of the past and to pass it on to the future. The man who is indifferent in his politics and permits others to think for him, leaves him and count his vote to be recanted to the highest bidder, devolves upon man. If such a person could realize the criminality of indifference in this matter he could not look into the bright eyes of his baby boy or girl, without experiencing a sense of self-condemnation so crushing that it would be driven to shake off his lethargy and indifference and make a firm resolve henceforth to do his duty.

In trying times like these, when the selfish spirit of commercialism is paralyzing the conscience and stifling the patriotism of millions of our people, it is refreshing and inspiring to realize that Heaven has vouchsafed to the people a leader whose purposes are lofty and pure, whose genius is surpassing, whose courage is based upon an abiding faith in both God and man, and who seems endowed with almost superhuman endurance to lead them against the powers of evil. Such a leader is Bryan. The world has had but few examples of such, and each of them turned the tide in human affairs and their names have become landmarks on the pathway of human progress. The contrast between Bryan and a great natural leader of men, and that of politicians who are self-seeking opportunities and time-servers is as great as the difference between truth and error. It is not to be wondered at then that this man has made an impression upon the popular mind, and has attracted to him the hearts of his countrymen to such an extent that the crowds that greet him everywhere he goes cause plenary to marvel and tremble.

Bryan represents in his public and private life, in a prominent degree, the forces of heroism and the highest morality. He has an abiding faith in the right and quails before no undertaking and sees no obstacles too great to be overcome. They stand in the way of the perfect realization of that brotherhood of man proclaimed in the New Testament. He has none of the arts of the politician yet he is leading the hosts of America against the power of wealth and privilege entrenched in the government, with a force that is as irresistible as the sweep of an avalanche.

In talking to the people he speaks volumes of philosophy, wisdom and argument in a sentence so simple that the average mind instantly grasps, comprehends and believes. His simplicity of statement and power of argument at once dispel the cunning

sophistries of the learned advocates who prostitute their talents for gain, and inspire intelligence, hope and resolution in the breasts of the great masses that his enemies have practically retired from the field of open encounter, and are driven to place their sole reliance for victory over the people in the employment of criminals whose wiles are to be lying, deceit and bribery.

During four years Mr. Bryan has been leading public thought on the great questions of the day in the forum of the nation, and today his enemies who have been lying in ambush and waiting for the first opportunity to acknowledge their defeat and helplessness, and to look on in chagrin while plain people of the great democratic party are nominating him for the presidency, by endorsing his candidacy in open conventions, and placing the most able and ablest of all delegates that are chosen to represent them in the national convention.

Such a spectacle cannot fail to make its impress upon the hearts and consciences of the millions of honest voters of the opposition party, and to compel them to note the contrast between the perfunctory performance that Hanna and his jumping jacks will go through with at Philadelphia on the 19th of June in comparison with the supreme role of the people that will characterize the convention at Kansas City on the 12th of September. The country will be presented with a choice between the two. The money kings, trusts and monopolies realize the tremendous power of the people when they are aroused into activity and have no doubt that the country will place unbounded trust, and the wisest among them fear that even the most desperate efforts are doomed to certain failure.

The political contest that is now on in the United States is engaging the attention of the civilized world, and the entire world. They look upon this as the final contest to settle forever the fate of free governments among men. The success of the American people will be heralded by every lover of liberty as the assurance that a government resting on the consent of the governed where mankind form one great brotherhood to endure forever, and that every throne upon which despotism sits must crumble to the dust before the onward and upward march of humanity, following the example of the great American republic.—National Watchman.
