SHEEP WAR THREATENED.

A Morrow County Man Reports a Grave Situation at Long Creek.

James Leach, a Lexington, Ore., farmer, was in Portland, Wednesday on his way to visit his old home at Harrisburg, says the Oregonian. He has just made a trip through the John Day and Long Creek valleys this summer and says grass was never so abundant in the blue mountains as now. Sheep shearing is just being brought to a close in the Six-Shooter region of Grant county, and the fleeces are of unprecedented size and weight. No breaks or weak spots being detected in the long, clean fiber, shepherders, although getting 7 cents a head and board for their work this spring, are not making as good wages as when the fleeces were lighter and the pay was 5 or 6 cents, as there is so much more wool to handle. A crew of 25 men now will hardly shear 1000 head per day while if the fleeces were lighter they would easily overrun this figure.

He looks for trouble between the Long Creek stockmen and the Morrow county sheepmen. If the latter persist in bringing their flocks into that portion of the John Day Valley this summer or fall, the Long Creek men, he says, are organized and have given notice in their local papers that outside sheep will be kept out at all hazards.

"And I hardly blame them," he continued, "as some of the graze sheepmen have fenced in a lot of government land for winter range, and they keep out all other stock, of course, they own a good deal of dead land, but in fencing this in they include a lot that still belongs to the government."

"The blue mountains are settling up rapidly, and every little bit that can be fenced and made to raise a garden now sports its cabin and barn. Many of the new settlers have a little live-stock of their own which they expect to pasture on the adjacent mountain sides, so every new settler will add his influence to the opposition that is being organized against the incursions of traveling sheep."

"The Long Creek men have been shooting into traveling flocks in former years in order to warn their owners to keep out of that portion of the country, but this year I am pretty sure they intend to kill herders as well as sheep. They reason that if herders are killed the sheep will be withdrawn, as men could not be obtained to accompany the bands into a hostile country."

THE CULTURE OF FLAX.

In Eastern Oregon It Should Be Sown in the Fall.

J. M. Turner, of Portland, who is interested in the growth of flaxseed in Eastern Oregon, says the outlook for a good crop in Morrow county is splendid this year, and that he looks for flax-raising to become a permanent industry there. Last year the crop did not come up to expectations, on account of the lack of moisture in the early summer, he says, but farmers are learning that flax can stand dry weather better than wheat. "Crops must be planted in the fall, however," he says, "as no dependence can be placed in spring sowing. Nature sows its grass seeds in the fall, and man

must follow suit, so as to take advantage of all the moisture that falls. The flax fields in the neighborhood of Ione now present a flourishing appearance, though the spring-sown wheat in that vicinity begins to show signs of suffering for rain. The flax will yield well, no matter how the weather turns out, which shows that it needs less moisture than the larger grains."

THE RESULTS MIXED.

Some Peculiarities of the Late Oregon Election.

While the returns show that in many of our states the Oregon is republican by over 10,000 plurality, they also show a remarkable amount of independent voting, and that in most counties hundreds of voters picked out their favorites among the candidates, with little regard to politics.

In the Portland Telegram, a few illustrations may be interesting in Baker county the fanatics gave Smith a plurality and elected the member of the legislature, but most of the republicans on the county ticket were elected. In Umatilla county just the opposite result is noticed.

Most of the republican candidates for the legislature received nearly 400 majority. Clatsop county went two to one for Moody for congress, yet elected fusion members of the legislature. In Wasco county Moody has more than 1000 majority, while Bossert, a democrat, carried the county by over 100 for state senator, though other counties in his district overcame this plurality.

Washington county has been considered one of the strong and safe republican counties in the strong and safe republican counties in the state, and a considerable populist sentiment, and while it went for Wolverson and Tongue, it elected the whole fusion county ticket, including four anti-republican members of the legislature.

Clackamas county, that went for the fusion ticket, which was previously captured it, two years ago, and was supposed to be strongly republican, elects a mixed ticket, giving pluralities for Daly on the one hand and Bailey on the other. Mounting Photographic Prints.

One of the greatest difficulties in mounting photographic prints is to prevent them from curving when dry; as this is due to the contraction of the print after having been distended by the water, a paste must be used containing as little water as possible.

The following formula is recommended: Common gelatine, 2 parts; water, parts; alcohol, 5 parts. The alcohol is added slowly as much as the gelatine is well dissolved in the water and the vessel turned continually to obtain a homogeneous mixture. The solution must be kept hot during the operation, and should be applied quickly, as it soon dries; the print
