A CRY OVER SPILLED MILK.

An Old-Time Republican Gives Vent to His Displeas and Chagrin. Pendleton, Or., June 9.—To the Editor.—The results of the election in this state indicate indorsement of expansion, protection and gold standard, both our congressmen were re-elected by increased pluralities. There is no denying the fact that the voters of this state are thoroughly wedded to the expansion sentiment and by their indorsement of the republican ticket hope to witness the early development of Oriental commerce, which will provide for our surplus products wider and better markets. Our legislative tickets were cut and slashed in Multnomah and other counties, resulting in our majority on joint ballot being reduced from 41 to 24. This is attributed to the factional fight within the party over the re-election of McFriede.

It is cause for congratulation that the vote in this county indicates a republican majority of something like 400 votes and that the plurality vote in the state for republican congressmen reaches almost 15,000. There is much cause for regret, however, in the defeat of several of the republican nominees on the county ticket and the evident exultation of the renegade republicans who figured conspicuously in their defeat. There are so-called republicans in this county who can only see merit in a ticket that they themselves head, or dictate. These same rule-or-ruin, place hunters, let it be said, are indebted to the very men whose defeat they are now congratulating themselves over for every dollar they have and for every success they have attained in this county who are in the public and in this district. There are men in public and private life who blunt their sentiments concerning those with whom they disagree, but in nearly every case such men can be depended upon to stand firm and manfully by their party ticket if indeed they do not take off their coats and work for its success. But there are others, while displeased with their party's management—displeased because denied the privilege of dictating their party's nominations, will greet you with smiles, openly avow intention to support the ticket, because of their "loyalty" to the party, yet will lay awake at night, speculating on the overthrow and disruption of their party. It was no accident, however, that in this county the republican ticket in this county met with disaster—a disaster that will require years of hard work and careful management to overcome. A few of those who have figured prominently in the councils of the party in this county, in their apparent ability and shrewdness of manner were wholly responsible for the apathy on the part of republican voters, resulting in the loss of the district attorney, county judge, sheriff, clerk and auditor. The men who raised the cry of "dirty politics" in this county, as a means of circumventing the defeat of the republican ticket, are men who have held office the greater part of their lives in this section. Not satisfied with six, ten, or more years of office in this county, these self-constituted politicians insist upon sinking the public boat for all time to come. It remains to be seen how long, if ever, the part played by these renegade republicans in the late election will be forgotten and forgiven.

By the exercise of a little care there will be less of this kind of people to raise up to explain their party to those who have reason to look upon them as their friends. A moral wilderness has stamps and trambles and tristles the same as the physical wilderness and the work of clearing it away is a most weary. But the brush in time can be cast aside and burned and welcome flowers will spring up to give to the party a new fragrance.

OLD-TIME REPUBLICAN. Gas Engines. It is suggested that it will be profitable to try the experiment of using gas engines for driving ships, the gas being generated on the vessel itself. Coal will be roasted in retorts aboard the ship in order to drive off the gas for the engines. The coke thus produced, says a writer in the World, would furnish the fuel needed to roast the coal. The purpose of the experiment which is to take place is to ascertain whether the saving of weight of the gas-producing plant and gas-consuming engines over the ordinary means of steam boilers and engines and the saving of space are sufficient to warrant the adoption of a new system.

The Chinese "Boxers." The Chinese "Boxers" are said to correspond in some degree with those Americans who comprised the Know Nothing Party, that flourished for awhile about a half a century ago. Their political slogan was "America for Americans," and the battle-cry of the "Boxers" is "China for the Chinese." They are carrying on a campaign that amounts almost to an insurrection against their central government, though possibly on its behalf or through its sympathy and connivance, because of the presence in China of so many foreigners, especially missionaries.
