WILLIAM DESIRES TO RESIGN.

Will give up the Chairmanship of the Fire Department for Personal Reasons. Charles Greenlich, chief of the Pendleton Fire department has asked the board of directors to relieve him of his position, and to appoint another man in his place. He has resigned for personal reasons, and has explained the best of relations with the council and the members of the department. He has been a most efficient and efficient, with the changes necessary under the reorganization of the year, and he has made himself a valuable asset to the department. ATHENA AND WESTON.

East End to Be Well Represented Here on the Fourth.

Athens, Or., June 28.—The East End will be well represented in Pendleton on July 4. Many members of the different secret societies will attend and join in the evening. The sports will also attract attention. A number of athletes will contest for the prizes. Among the last mentioned is Will McCollum, of Athens, who is acknowledged to be a crack sprinter. He has his eyes riveted on the gold medal in the 200-yard foot-race. If he concludes to enter, he will make his competitors step along pretty lively to keep him from winning. Green Estes has disposed of nearly all his property here, and has removed to Pendleton to reside. The second kiln of brick of the season has been turned at May's brickyard. They are now setting the third kiln.

Weston, Oregon, June 28.—William Blair has a small piece of peculiar grain growing near his mill. It is called wheat-corn, and comes from Russia. It has a kernel and head something similar to wheat, although much longer, while it assays almost identically to corn, from a chemical standpoint. This kind of grain grows rank and high, and yields enormously. Mr. Blair said his 1000 patch would yield at the rate of 75 or 80 bushels to the acre, while in Russia yields have been announced of as high as 125 bushels to the acre. Mr. Blair's experiment will undoubtedly attract the attention of farmers throughout the country.

TEXT OF SIDEWALK ORDINANCE.

Law Amends the One Formerly in Force and Allows No Goods Displayed. The new law as adopted by the city council Wednesday evening providing that no goods shall be kept on the sidewalks of Pendleton, being amendatory of the ordinance which has been effective for sometime, is as follows, this being the complete text of the new ordinance: Ordinance No. 363.—An ordinance to amend ordinance No. 336, section 9. The people of the city of Pendleton do ordain as follows: Section 1. Section 9 of said ordinance 5'0. 336 is amended so as to read as follows: No person shall use or occupy or use any part of any sidewalk or pavement in displaying any goods, wares or merchandise or produce of any kind; and no part of the outer or center portion of any street and no part of any street shall be used for the display of any goods, wares, or merchandise, for the placing or piling up of any oil or cans, dry goods, or any boxes or packages, or beer, whiskey or other barrels or kegs, or for the erection of any sign board, barber pole, bicycle rack or any other thing that will tend to impede the free and unobstructed passage of pedestrians or vehicles; provided, that goods in transit from delivery wagons to stores or dwellings shall be allowed to occupy three feet of the outer edge of the sidewalk for the space of one hour and no longer; and that cordwood or other fuel may be suffered to remain closely corded or piled upon the street adjacent to where the same is to be in a manner to least disturb the passage of vehicles for the space of 4 hours and no longer. Ordinance and parts of ordinance in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage by the common council and approval by the mayor. Passed the common council this 27th day of June, 1900. F. W. VINCENT, Mayor. Attest: J. E. BEAM, Recorder.

TALKED OF HIS EUROPEAN TRIP.

Charles Rohrman Returns After Touring the Continent. Charles Rohrman, one of the prosperous merchants of Pendleton, arrived home this morning, accompanied by Mrs. Rohrman. They have been in the European continent since April 4, and have visited numerous cities and points of interest. They were in Hamburg, Basel, Zurich, Carlsruhe, and other places, traveling all over Austria and France, and spending some time in Asch, Bohemia. Mr. Rohrman bought a large stock of china of the finest foreign makes, which he will soon receive at his store here. Talking of the Paris exposition, Mr. Rohrman was not so enthusiastic as might be expected. He declares that it is the almost unanimous verdict of Europe that the big Paris show is not so great an affair as was the World's Columbian Exposition at Chicago. "My countrymen, and indeed, people of other European countries," said Mr. Rohrman, "pronounce the Paris Exposition much below the Chicago exposition in points of excellence. It is purely a trade exposition, and the motive governing all the exhibitors seems to be only to advertise the various lines of trade represented. "Particularly, people compare the architecture of the buildings at the exposition with those built at Chicago, and pronounce the latter far superior. Of course, one sees numbers of things there which are wonderfully fine and interesting, nevertheless, most of the people with whom I talked were of the opinion that the Parisians have not come up to the standard set by those who planned and conducted the Chicago exposition." Mr. and Mrs. Rohrman spent ten days at the exposition.

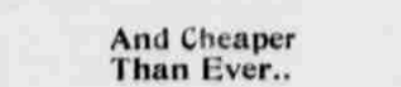

LAWTON COMPANY WINS OUT.

Land Office Decides Against the Claim of Ditmars. James A. Howard, secretary of the Lawton Investment company, received word from La Grande Wednesday evening saying that the land office had decided in favor of the company in the contest case instituted by Ditmars, of Granite, for the townsite of the town of Lawton. The case was heard a week ago before the land office officials at La Grande, and time was given up to June 20 for the filing by the contestant of additional testimony, and the decision was deferred until the filings should have been made. This was done, and the decision given afterward. The company expects, now that the contest has been thus decided, to secure a patent to the land in a short time, the delay which will occur being only that which always occurs in any case when a lot of real estate has to be wound and unwound at Washington. The patent is expected sometime in the fall.

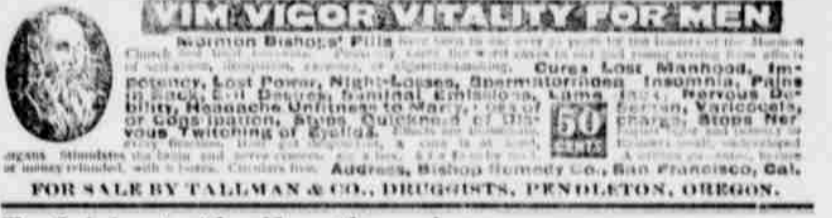
