PEKIN MASSACRE HAS LIKELY OCCURRED

News Agency in London Received Report That It Took Place on July 6th.

THOUGH NOT AFFIRMED IT IS BELIEVED

The Worst is Feared by Officials at Washington; Efforts Being Made to Get News From Minister Conger, But Probably It Is Too Late Now.

London, July 13.—A news agency report says an official message has been received in London that states all foreigners in Pekin were murdered on July 6.

The Story Not Affirmed. London, July 13.—Though there does not appear to be any justification for the statement that an official confirmation has been received of the massacre of the international colony at Pekin, it is hardly doubted that such a confirmation will be the outcome of the present suspense.

THE BOKRS WIN A VICTORY. They Succeed in Taking Nital's Nek From the British. London, July 13.—Lord Roberts reports to the war office under date of Pretoria, July 12, as follows:

No Hope Left in Washington. Washington, July 13.—A cablegram from Consul General Goodnow, at Shanghai, announcing the beginning of the final attack on the legations at Pekin has terribly depressed the officials here.

Some More Chinese News. Brussels, July 13.—The Belgian foreign office has received a dispatch from Shanghai announcing, in Chinese authority, that General Si Chang defeated the rebels near Pekin and relieved Prince Ching and General Yung Lu, who were trying to defend the Europeans.

Should Have Been Done Before. Washington, July 13.—The Chinese minister here has undertaken to get through a cable message from Secretary Hay to United States Minister Conger at Pekin, and to have an answer brought back if Conger is alive.

Terrible Veil of Silence. London, July 13.—A terrible veil of silence enshrouds Pekin and there is nobody left who believes the worst news that has been reported.

The Slaughter at Pekin. London, July 13.—The Shanghai correspondent of the Daily Mail says the following story regarding the position in Pekin emanates from Chinese official sources:

Statements are in circulation in Shanghai, accusing the Russians of indiscriminate slaughter of friendly Chinese non-combatants without regard to age or sex.

Murray, chief of the Illinois Central Railway detectives, and two men, supposed to be train robbers, George W. Barnes was arrested today.

Martial Law at Cape Nome. Helena, Montana, July 13.—Neal Vauter, United States marshal for Alaska, Deputy Marshal Myer and George Leekly, chief clerk, have left here for Cape Nome.

The St. Louis Strike Strengthened. St. Louis, July 13.—Two thousand solicitors, engaged by the trades and labor unions of St. Louis to canvass the city, and collect contributions for the striking street railway men's bus line, went out today.

Savings Bank Closes. New York, July 13.—The directors of the Dime Savings bank, of Newark, N. J., decided to close the institutions' doors until affairs can be straightened out.

Killed by Lightning. Dubuque, Iowa, July 13.—A terrific electric storm, accompanied by rain which fell to a depth of nearly 2 inches, raged here today.
