The charred remnant of a skeleton, with pitch wood stakes partly burned, was uncovered at Walla Walla recently. It is thought to be the remains of a white man, tortured by savages years ago.

Work on the Pendleton waterworks improvements is temporarily at a standstill, while the council committee watches the effect on the water supply in the well that is being dug, by reason of the shutting off of the water from the Byers millrace.

Walla Walla has trouble on hand about music for its fair. The committee engaged a Seattle brass band but 200 local business men have signed a petition in favor of the employment of the home band.

The democratic, populist and silver republican state convention for the nomination of presidential electors, two congressmen and state officers, will be held in Seattle Monday, August 7.

The O. R. & N. expects a big party of excursionists to go to Meacham and intermediate points on next Sunday. Travel thither on Sundays is increasing each week, and last Sunday 78 tickets were sold from this station.

Wheat aphids is playing havoc with many crops in Lane county, says the Eugene Register. Some fields are literally covered with the little pests. Spring wheat promises to be about as badly damaged as the fall crop.

G. W. Rigby brought to town Monday evening samples of his wheat. It was prime No. 1 in grade, testing 62 pounds to the bushel, and he says he has 1000 acres of the same wheat which he now is harvesting.

A new town has been started east of Union, Union county, and is to be known as Burckmont. A copper prospect is being developed there by an eastern concern. It is claimed the company has found a ledge of copper ore, nearly 1000 feet wide and nine miles long.

In the estate of Anna Dickey, deceased, C. R. Wade, the administrator, files his first report in which he shows that the inventory of the estate revealed \$750 in personal property, and \$250 in realty, consisting of lots 4 and 5 block 6, in Koon's addition to the town of Echo. He has collected in all \$1000, and paid out \$320.

The Fletcher company, owners of a sawmill in the mountains beyond Weston, have filed liens against Simon Hago, to recover \$75.90 for lumber supplied, attaching lots 2 and 4 of section 18, township 7 N., range 37 E., and against Lizzie Dilling, to recover \$49.78 for lumber, attaching the e/s of the n/w 1/4 and the e/s of the s/w 1/4 of section 27 township 6 north, range 34 west.
