EXTENSIVE FARMING IN JUNIPER.

Juniper County, July 18.—L. M. Hunt, of the Juniper county, was in the city today, for repairs to his automobile. He says there are nine or ten farms in his neighborhood, raising about four to twelve acres of wheat. Each farmer has a threshing machine, and he says that the wheat is not as high as those paid for by the threshing-machine men near here.

Mr. Hunt states that he only has

25 acres of wheat this year, and that it will go almost, if not fully, 40 bushels to the acre. His three sons, however, have wheat galore. They have thirteen quarter sections, including the Paine ranch, sown to wheat, and within the next 30 days will have reaped over 100,000 bushels of their grain. That may properly be said to be a large amount for a whole state. Their wheat fields equal a section of country two miles long and a quarter wide, with a piece of ground of a quarter square thrown in for good measure.

As regards to the quality of the wheat

the year Hunt said that 10 sacks were raised by him of wheat raised by his boys, from two settings, and that it weighed 14 1/2 pounds to the bush. This is the heaviest wheat, by all odds, that has ever been harvested in the Juniper country.

THE STATE SCHOOL AT WESTON.

NEW PRINCIPAL IS A LEARNED AND EXPERIENCED INSTRUCTOR.

The School Will Now Be Able to Pursue its Purpose and Perform Some Good Work.

Weston, Oregon, July 18.—The future is bright with promise for the Eastern Oregon State Normal school of this city. Prospects for a large attendance were never better, and inquiries are coming in daily from those who contemplate attending during the coming year.

Reference has already been made in these columns to the satisfactory effort of the board of regents in finding a man for the office of president of the Eastern Oregon State Normal school. A more extended acquaintance with Prof. Beattie has convinced the board of regents, the faculty and the others who have met him that the right man has been selected. Through his able management the State Normal at Fern, Nebraska, that institution has been given high rank among normal schools throughout the middle states and his ability to bring a life of study and his experience in conducting a school for the preparation of teachers is a matter of congratulation to the management and patrons of the Eastern Oregon State Normal as well as the friends of education throughout the state. The demand for a high grade institution to meet rapid growth of the state is known to all who have given the matter any attention, and the public are assured that no effort shall be lacking to meet this just demand. The purpose of the Normal school is to prepare men and women for teaching in the common schools of Oregon. The State Normal school is not an institution for general culture for its own sake; it is a special school—a professional school. That it must give broad and liberal culture is true. Its final purpose, however, is to confer on its students that education and practical skill which will best fit them for teaching in the public schools of Oregon.

The first term will open September 11, 1900, Monday, September 10, being devoted to the enrollment and classification of students.

H. W. Monica, A. B., vice-president, Physical and Natural Sciences.

Mrs. M. C. Byam, superintendent of training department.

Miss Nellie M. Stevens, assistant in training department.

Miss Maude Harkleroad, Vocal Music.

The members of the faculty for Instrumental Music, Reading and Elocution, and Physical Training are to be supplied.

Those desiring information in regard to the school are invited to correspond with Prof. H. W. Monica, vice-president of the institution, whose address is Weston, Oregon. All necessary information will be cheerfully and promptly furnished.

Building Branch Warehouses.
Weston, Or., July 18.—George Williams returned home last evening, having completed the warehouse at Cayuse station for the Pacific Coast Elevator company. The building is 40x20 feet. Mr. Williams and the force of fifteen men will now go to Walla Walla and build four warehouses, each 40x160 feet, for the Western Warehouse company.

SOME DISGUSTED CAPE NOMERS.
Two Peasleet Men Think the Bubble has Burst—Treaty for Steamers.

W. B. and N. M. Eldridge, business men of Peasleet, who maintain a trading post on the Fort Hall reservation, in Idaho, and who stopped here Wednesday on their way home from Nome City, returned to Seattle on the Farallon, on which came back a large number of Nome stamperers. Other boys, say the Eldridges, stated, are bringing back full loads of disgusted Cape Nomers, whose reports are anything but encouraging for persons contemplating going to the northern Bering sea gold fields.

According to the Eldridge brothers, the few claims which were obtained at first when the gold was discovered on the beach constitute all of the ground that is worth working. The remainder is valueless, and no one there believes really that any gold will ever be taken out. They concede that the few claims first found are very rich, but they say that two or three men own all of the good ones.

"At the present time," said one of them, "there are thousands of persons at Nome City and along the beach who are completely strapped. These people have absolutely no means whereby to purchase passage back to the states, and it is already a serious problem how they are to be cared for. If they remain, they will inevitably suffer severely during the winter, as it is a cold-blooded country in which men have to pay round sums for what they get. Clearly the small place in the breasts of people who go to the Cape Nome region, just as it did in the Klondike.

Men Will Be Desperate.
"Undoubtedly, the government will have to take some action. Otherwise, the thousands of busted men will be in a desperate condition."

Wages have dropped to \$3.50 a day, with ten men for every job. As the season advances, the work will be less and less, until a little later practically no work will be had for anyone.

"Only in one way can the stranded men make it through the winter, which will come on now in a few weeks. That is by forming emergency societies, arming themselves, and forcing those owning provisions to divide with them."

It is beyond speculation that the Cape Nome boom is a punctured bubble, and that already the people are taking the back trail. Nearly all who can will come home this summer, and a fishing schooner will be able to carry all new stamperers who will desire to go another year. We were in a position to obtain knowledge of the inside facts, too, for one of the men owning the rich claims is an old friend of Prof. Beattie, and he corroborates our assertions.

Assistant Supt. M. J. Buckley, of this division, was on the ground, and arranged for an investigation today at La Grande as to the responsibility for the wreck. He took measurements of distances, and the matter will be probed to the bottom.
