LOCAL WHEAT IS UNCHANGED.

Charter Situation Same as a Week Ago - Waiting for New Market to Organize. Charters are quoted now at 45 shillings, and the local wheat market appears to be at the same point at which it stood a week ago—45c a bushel for No. 1 club. The new crop has been brought into the question, and probably hereafter the old wheat will be simply a secondary element in the quotations. Some wheat goes to the seaboard, and threshing continues all over the country. Quality holds up to the No. 1 grade, the yield being less than was expected. In all likelihood, when the history of 1900's crop is written, the total turnout will be proven to be something like 25 per cent less than the records of bumper years, although it is bound to be a good yield.

Wheat in Portland.

Portland, July 26.—The Commercial Review, in today's issue says of the wheat market: The local market remains dull and weak, and continues in a most unsatisfactory condition. There are not many buyers actively in the market, and sellers find conditions against them. The relatively strong position of tonnage has had considerable effect upon wheat values, and it is undoubtedly the firmness of freights that keeps grain has given way. A number of sales of small parcels were made during the week, almost entirely of Eastern Oregon and Washington. We hear that 57 cents per bushel was paid for Walla Walla wheat, which figure is rather above its current value, based upon existing rates for tonnage, but is accounted for by exporters who made favorable early charters being willing to part with a portion of their freight profit and give quick dispatch to such vessels as may arrive next month. Nominally Walla Walla wheat is offered here at 55 cents; a number of on dock; bluestem, 57 cents; and Valley, 54 to 55 cents. Usually at this time of the year exporters are heavy purchasers of grain, and in former years there has been more or less competition among buyers to secure desirable parcels, and active buying movement has as a rule been decidedly favorable to the selling interest; but now there is little or no disposition shown by exporters to compete on offerings, and present conditions compel sellers to seek buyers, rather than buyers to hunt up sellers.

Wheat in San Francisco.

San Francisco, July 26.—The wheat market is dull. Holders are anticipating better prices and are now offering very freely. Shippers are not chartering tonnage at present; most of them look for lower freight rates. Shippers are in the market at all times, but are indifferent when it comes to paying fancy prices. The advices from abroad are dull and markets weak, and this in a measure has an effect upon the situation here. Crop reports state that the crop will not be as large as heretofore estimated; most conservative figures, No. 1 shipper's wheat is quoted at \$1.05; milling, \$1.10 per cental.

Wool in Boston.

Boston, July 26.—The wool is dull. Little is doing. Prices are largely guess work. Quotations—unwashed medium, etc., Missouri quarter-blood, combed, 23 to 24 cents; three-eighths world for stomach, liver, kidneys and bowels. Only 25 cents at Tallman & Co.'s drug store.
