PROSPEROUS BUTTER CREEK.

Mr. McManus Thinks It is a Garden Spot Where Everyone Has Plenty. John P. McManus has returned to Pendleton from a trip throughout the Butter creek country, and reports the charge of assault with intent to kill, and camping along the route. He thus combined business and pleasure. Speaking of the prosperous condition of the people there, he said: "One who for the first time visits the Butter creek region is impressed with the uniformly prosperous condition of the people. Prosperity is not the exception, but as a matter of fact, lack of prosperity is absolutely not known down there."

"I verily believe that one may go along the creek and take forty men, one after another, just as you come to them, and find that they are worth each year. Irrigation in places transforms the natural desert into a productive region, and permits the taking from the soil of vast quantities of produce for the fattening of the fine herds of cattle that are there owned. Butter creek has become one of the supply spots for the trade in fat beef, and buyers go there regularly throughout the season for trailhead or trainload of steers."

THE HOTEL PENDLETON'S BIG RUN.

Hostelry Has Been Crowded to Its Capacity, in Spite of Dull Season. When the overland train arrived last night, travelers who went to the Hotel Pendleton found it difficult to obtain rooms. This was because the house had been crowded. Being asked for the full season was affecting the hotel business of Pendleton, Mr. Van Dran, proprietor of the Hotel Pendleton said: "We expected that at this time of year the business would fall off materially, and that for quite a number of weeks the travelers would not be much to be expected. But we have been grossly disappointed, for our house has been doing all the business it could, up to the capacity. I have been surprised at the volume of passenger traffic that flows through this little city. When we came here a month or two ago, we looked for few business, and expected it to fall off during the summer months, when so many of the commercial men seek the seashore for their vacations. There seem all the time to be enough traveling men on the road to maintain a fine business for the hotels, and we are more than satisfied with that which we are now doing."

ASSAULT WITH INTENT TO KILL.

LATEST DEVELOPMENT IN THE BOWLIN EXTRADITION CASE.

George Reynolds, J. W. Dykes and the Mysterious Man in a Mask Are Charged as Above.

Weston, July 28.—(Special to the East Oregonian).—Mrs. J. B. Bowlin, wife of the Kentuckian whom Kentuckians tried unsuccessfully to extradite, has sworn to complaints against George Reynolds, of this place, J. W. Dykes, constable of Milton justice court, and G. C. Moore, one of the two Kentuckians who came after Bowlin. Reynolds has been already arrested, and officers have gone to Milton to get Dykes. Complaint was made before Justice L. S. Wood of the Weston district.

The serious charge thus brought against the three men mentioned in the out of the attempt made on Wednesday night by Dykes, Reynolds and the mysterious man in a linen duster and a mask to take Bowlin from his home in the dead of night, upon a warrant signed by Governor Geor which, it is understood here, was surreptitiously taken from the sheriff at Pendleton under promise by Moore, who is a lawyer and therefore accorded the courtesies of the profession; and further, that the warrant had already been once served, Bowlin having been tried in habeas corpus proceedings and acquitted.

During the attempt to take Bowlin, as he escaped into the darkness from the three men who were at the time in Bowlin's house, two shots were fired by the party of three, and later another shot as Bowlin sped down the street. Two bullet holes in the door of Bowlin's house testify to the first two shots, while numerous citizens heard the third shot as they rushed out from their homes, to ascertain the cause of the disturbance.

It appears to be the opinion that the third man of the trio, who wore a linen duster and had on his face a mask, was Moore, the Kentucky lawyer.

Probably Extradite Moore.

Moore has been in Walla Walla, liking the climate of the state of Washington better during the past few days than the climate of Oregon. In the event it is determined to bring him to this county under the charge of assault with intent to kill, of course he must be extradited. This opens up a vista of possibilities for further proceedings to see the end of which taxes the most acute prophetic eyesight. It is not anticipated that Moore will come of his own free will to answer the charge of assault with intent to kill. Hence, if he come he must be brought. Governor Geor must make requisition upon Governor Rogers, Governor Rogers must issue an executive warrant, officers of Washington must arrest him and turn him over to Oregon officials, and then he may be brought here for trial. Perhaps there will be habeas corpus proceedings, and releases and more habeas corpus proceedings, but probably no night trials to take him from his home.

REASON FOR BOWLIN'S RELEASE.

Governor's Warrant was Defective in Form, Hence Acquittal. The county court of this county has been placed in a false light by a statement that has gained currency in the public prints that J. B. Bowlin, over whose attempted extradition so many exciting things have happened, was released in habeas corpus proceedings on the plea that he was wanted in Kentucky for political reasons. Such a proposition at no time entered into the case, was not at any time mentioned in the trial, and was entirely foreign to the affair. The records show that Judge Hartman turned Bowlin loose on the plea that the executive warrant issued by Governor Geor was defective, in that it did not state that
