UMATILLA'S ASSESSMENT.

Valuation Nearly a Million Less Than Last Year.

County Assessor George Buzan and his assistant, have finished writing the assessment roll of Umatilla county for the year 1900, and they are now at work on the findings to get the exact value of the county for the year 1900, and while the exact figures for this year are not yet obtainable, enough is known to warrant the statement that the assessment will show that the value of the county will be about 15 per cent., which will mean a loss of \$1,000,000 less than 1899.

BUSY SCOURING WOOL.

The local institution has no cause for complaint.

The Pendleton wool scouring mill has scoured 948,711 pounds of wool this season thus far, and there is 750,000 pounds in sight to be scoured. One hundred thousand pounds of Koshland wool will be brought to the mill this week to be scoured. The mill was run night and day for six weeks, then it was the daytime only for several weeks. This week an attempt was again made to run day and night, but it had to be given up, owing to scarcity of man. F. E. Judd, when interviewed this morning, stated that as much wool would be scoured here this year as ordinarily, for the reason that the price of wool had gone down and much of it remained in first hands and was being held for better prices. He expressed himself as well satisfied with the amount that had already been secured and in sight, under the adverse circumstances.

PUT OUT CAMPING FIRES.

NECESSITY FOR EXTRA CAUTION, DURING THE DRY SEASON.

The Matter Requires Attention in Many Quarters—Denial of Mountains Goes on With Great Rapidity.

Reports from the mountain districts of Oregon and Washington are calculated to emphasize the warning given by District Attorney Halley that violations of the law against setting fires or leaving them when breaking camp will be punished. The very dry season now on will increase the danger and render it necessary for special caution to be exercised. The mountain streams are in most localities carrying less water than in ordinary seasons, and this makes the danger greater.

The question is receiving attention in all parts of the mountain regions, and press, authorities and lumbermen are hopeful that the people will pay heed to the necessities of the situation. Thoughtful people will appreciate the need for preserving the forests which are already being depleted with sufficient rapidity to insure the denudation of the mountains at an early day.

What the Telegram Says.

"An Eastern Oregon district attorney has officially called attention to the necessity for the exercise of great care by campers in the mountains in fully extinguishing fires that they have kindled. He says: 'People should bear in mind that there are strict laws regulating the setting of fires, and providing penalties for all who cause their setting and fail to extinguish them. It is a small matter to see that the fire is put out, when breaking camp, and this is especially needed this year.'"

"This is a warning that it would be well for every official having authority in the matter, and every newspaper in Oregon to repeat and keep before the people throughout the dry season. Enforcement of the law spoken of is difficult, but an example should be made in any case where the law is being broken. More can be accomplished, however, in the way of preventing forest fires, by agitation, information, advice, warning and adjuration. Most of them arise through carelessness, and not from malice or mischief, and it is important that every one be educated to understand the importance of preserving our forests, and the damage that forest fires have done, and may yet do, in Oregon."

In all probability a building will have to be erected especially for the show."

Mr. Conill says that since the last pet stock show over \$5,000 has been expended by Walla Wallans in the pet stock industry and that the poultry raising business in this county is rapidly increasing.
