POLITICAL SPECULATION.

New York World: Since 1872 Ohio has held twenty-five elections. Of these the republicans have carried twenty-one and the democrats four. Not once during this period has a democratic presidential ticket prevailed in Ohio, although in 1862 the republican plurality was only 1072.

The years when the democrats carried the state were 1877, 1882, 1888 and 1899. In almost every instance the prominent issue before the people when the democrats won their victory was that of the tariff.

In 1894, for example, immediately after the disgraceful tariff fight of that year, their candidate for secretary of state lost by a majority of 137,087 votes. The next year their plurality was 92,622. It is significant of Mr. McKinley's and Senator Hanna's position in the state that the republican plurality of 1896 fell to 48,497.

It was Mr. Hayes's victory over Gov. Allen on the money question which made the former the republican candidate for president in 1876. There has been a soft-money faction in the democratic party of the state since 1868, when Mr. Pendleton was a candidate for the presidential nomination on the greenback issue, but the state itself has been hard money.

Ohio is a singularly American state, its foreign-born population in 1890 being only 12.51 per cent of its total population of 3,672,316. In 1890 and 1870 the percentage of foreign born to native had been, according to each census, about 14 per cent.
