#### THE MARKETS.

##### Wheat Barely Holds Its Own in the Local Market.

There has been no noticeable change in the price of wheat during the past week. The market of the sales are being made at 45 to 47c for red chaff and 47c and 49 to 50 for bluestem. There have been offers made and refused at the above figures, but local millers say they are getting plenty of wheat to grind, and that is what they are paying. Exporters start their bids at 43c for No. 1 red chaff, and buy at whatever they can.

Cattle and hogs are active and prices very firm. Cows are worth \$3 to \$3.25 per hundred pounds on foot delivered at Pendleton. Steers \$3.75 per hundred. Hogs are 55c per pound on foot, delivered at Pendleton.

##### Wheat in Portland.

Portland, Sept. 6.—The Commercial Review, its issue of today, says of the wheat market: The new crop season has fairly set in, receipts are daily growing larger, farmers are selling and vessels are taking on wheat and the situation generally is active. Exporters have made provision for tonnage to the tune of the week so that with a continuation of free selling our clearances during the balance of the current year ought to make a satisfactory showing. The only drawback to what would otherwise be a most acceptable state of affairs is the cheapness of wheat, and poor net returns to the farming class, but this is something beyond the control of either seller or buyer, the price being established by the supply and demand. At the present time it would appear as though all exporting countries were pressing supplies on the market, and there is no doubt about their being in abundance of wheat in sight to meet the requirements of importing countries for months to come. The strong tone prevailing for and higher freight rates which are now firm at 45c to 48c 3d had an unfavorable effect upon wheat values. The bulk of local transactions the past week were on the basis of 37c for club, 38c for valley and 40c for blue stem per bushel, yet it appears that these figures paid for grain are something above its relative shipping value, and it is not unlikely that unless the English market advances in the near future we will look for lower prices here. Local dealers at present are quoting club, 56 to 57c; blue stem, 56c, and valley 60c per bushel, the latter quality being in good demand. Millers in the interior are running prices up and dealers here are compelled to meet the raise.

##### Wheat in San Francisco.

San Francisco, Sept. 6.—There has been very liberal selling on the part of holders during the past week. The same was rather beyond the requirements of the present. Receipts have been heavy and exporters had no difficulty in securing what they needed for present or nearly due business. The light demand from Europe and the firm position of freights have caused the shippers to go slow. Many of them are out of the market, being well supplied with grain. Values are easy and in buyers' favor 1.02 1/2 to 1.05, being the range for No. 1 shipping wheat 7 milling, 1.07 1/2 to 1.10 per cental.
