Thomas Lewis, a farmer aged about

FLABBY-MINDED CHILDREN.
Bringing Them Up Along the Lines of
Least Resistance.

We see parents—possibly we are
parents—who bring up children "along
the lines of least resistance," says
Dean Briggs of Harvard university in
the October Atlantic, and we know
what the children are. It is flab-
biness, the lines of least resistance
are intellectually spoiled children,
flabby of mind and will. For any
responsible work we want men of char-
acter—not men who from childhood
up have been personally comforted and
have had their education warped to the
indolence of their minds. It is neces-
sary to treat people as individuals but
it does them a world of good some-
times to treat a great many of them to-
gether, and to let them get used to it
as best they may. The first lesson of
life, as Lowell reminds us, is to burn
our own smoke; that is, not to inflict
on outsiders our personal sorrows and
petty morbidness, not to keep thinking
of ourselves as exceptional cases. The
sons of our wealthiest citizens may be
educated in either of two ways—they
may be sent to school or they may be
turned over to governesses and private
tutors. Any one who has observed
them in college knows how much
better educated those are who have
gone to school—how the very wealth
which enables a parent to treat his son
as in all ways exceptional and to give
him the most costly and carefully ad-
justed education which he can devise,
defeats its own end.

Rats Cause Fire.
A Boston fire insurance company
recently made an interesting investiga-
tion to discover if possible whether
there is any reason for the popular be-
lief that rats and mice set fires by
gnawing matches, says the Youth's
Company. The experiment covered a
period of three months. Rats and
mice, singly or several at a time, were
confined in large iron cages containing
matches of various kinds and cotton
waste. The mice, no matter how hun-
gry they were, never gnawed the
matches, but the rats set several fires,
the sulphur matches being in each case
the instrument.
