Wallowa News: Died, at Wallowa,
Oct. 29, 1900, Uncle Jake Collins. The
old gentleman was visiting his
daughter, Mrs. R. W. Dougherty, when
he was suddenly taken ill and gradu-
ally got worse until death came. Mr.
Collins was a few days over 80 years of
age and had always been very strong
for one of his great age.

According to a telegram from Hepp-
ner, John P. Spencer, of Athena, 52
years of age, last Friday night at-
tempted to commit suicide by cutting
himself with a knife in the abdomen.
Martin Anderson took the knife from
him, and doctors dressed his wounds.
On being questioned he said that he
had been released from the insane asy-
lum at Salem two months ago. He
was admitted insane and was taken to
the asylum Sunday.

The Ukiah Sentinel says of the
Yukon mines in South Unalaska county
on Desolation creek that a deal is pend-
ing between J. F. Isaacs, the present
owner, and a Portland syndicate, and it
is understood that the trade will be
closed at once if the estimated cost of
the ditch is not too great. This ditch,
if constructed, will be the means of
bringing water on to several hundred
acres of valuable placer ground which
has not been worked before on account
of the scarcity of water.

Blue Mountain Eagle: Owners of
beef cattle are the most fortunate peo-
ple in Grant county today, since the
price that this stock commands is far
in excess of anything paid for years.
Owners of good beef stock can get al-
most their own price for them. Mr.
Hilton, a feeder who resides near Pen-
dleton, drove out a band of feeders
early last week which he procured in
Southern Grant county. He paid for
his band \$28 per head for two-year-
olds, and \$37 for three-year-olds.

A man whose name and all other
facts in connection with him are un-
known left a horse at Froome's Com-
mercial stables on Tuesday evening,
September 18, the first day of the Pen-
dleton street fair, and he has not since
appeared to claim the animal, nor has
he sent any word who he is, where he
is or where he intends to be. The
horse is a sorrel, nine or 10 years old,
and is branded "J. J." on left shoulder
and interlocked half circles on right
hip. A bill of \$8 has accumulated
against the horse, and a committee
consisting of L. C. Rothrock, Dr. V. J.
Davis and David E. Cargill decided
this morning that the animal and his
trappings were worth \$0, and ap-
praised the property at that figure.
The horse will be sold to pay charges
unless the owner should come to the
center pretty soon.

IMPERSONATED THE MARSHAL.

Jack Cummings, alias O'Brien is in a
Peck of Trouble.

John Cummings, alias O'Brien, is in
the clutches of the law, for impersonat-
ing an officer, to wit, the marshal of
Pendleton. The circumstances as told
by the chief witness, A. W. Johnson,
of Pilot Rock, are as follows:

Mr. Johnson was on Main street in
this city at about 10 o'clock on the
night of Saturday, October 6. He was
accosted by the defendant and asked
to take a walk. They went to the O.
R. & N. depot. After some conversa-
tion, Mr. O'Brien said to Johnson:
"I'll arrest you, anyhow. Come with
me," and grabbed him by the collar.
Mr. Johnson jerked away and ran to

the last chance saloon, where he re-
lated what had happened. When Mr.
O'Brien first spoke to Johnson he told
him his name was Cummings, and
that he was the marshal of Pendleton.
Mr. Johnson pointed out the defen-
dant to Officer Hickey later in the
night, who took him in. This morning
he was taken before Justice of the
Peace Fritz Gerald on a warrant sworn
out by Constable Bentley, charging
him with the crime of impersonating
an officer. He was held to answer to
the grand jury, which body is now
sitting, and his bail was fixed at \$250,
which he did not furnish.
