BIG CITY UP NORTH.

Teller to Be Main Sport of Evening

Teller, a new town on the shores of Port Clarence, is to be the main sport of evening sea, according to Dr. J. A. Roberts, who left Nome a few weeks ago, after spending the season as ship's surgeon in Alaskan waters, says the Oregonian. Teller, he says, is situated on a split which puts out into a well-protected harbor. It lies about 100 miles north of Nome, and already has become quite a success.

"There is no protection from storms at Nome," the doctor said at the Park yesterday, "and the many strands of wrecked vessels which will be seen along the beach at Nome show that it is risky to cast anchor there on the approach of a storm. Besides this, there is no way to build a city at Nome. The tundra, which intervenes between the sand beach and the foothills is 30 to 12 miles wide, and its wet, spongy nature prevents its being used as a foundation for permanent buildings. The exposed foothills of the Nome settlement renders it a prey to bleak winds in the winter and to the sudden squalls of summer, and much property was destroyed in the town the past season. Nome is no more fit for a permanent settlement than Galveston, Tex."

He looks quite a deal for that region, past year, notwithstanding the adverse reports which have been there all summer. "When that district is developed," he said, "it will produce as much gold as California did in its palmiest days. The real reports will come in from the outlying places when the men begin to push civilization after having worked among the distant creeks all last summer. Many of these came in before I left Nome last month, and the amount of gold dust brought in was surprising. Most of the men were very reticent, too, and tried to conceal their gold as much as possible, as that is not the safest place in the world to have valuables in one's possession."

**COAL IN CHINA.**  
America May Have to Import From That Country.  
Coal is the basis of manufacturing, as from it power is derived. It may be interesting to note the following:  
A report has recently been published upon the coal fields of China, and those around Tientsin were recently visited by Prof. Drake, who found that the workable coal in one bed about 250 feet above a flint-bearing limestone stratum, below which there may also be coal. The thickness of the same is probably not less than 22 feet and at one place it is worked through a shaft 329 feet deep. Prof. Drake estimates that within 150 square miles around Tientsin there are about 3000 million metric tons of coal. Most of Shan-si has been found underlain by large coal beds. It is also considered that the anthracite coal in the Shan-si amounts to 3000 million metric tons, and that the coal area is greater than that of Pennsylvania. Nearly all the coal is mined through shafts varying from 50 to 300. No steam is used for raising the coal to the surface, and explosives are not employed. Very

little coal is mined through inclines. For local use coal is taken away in carts drawn by oxen. It is practicable in the Shan-si coal beds to run long lines of railroad tunnels through the bed and load the cars in the mines for distant transportation.
