### GOVERNMENT OWNERSHIP.

In Australia on government-owned railroads you can ride a distance of 1000 miles for \$6.50, first-class, while workmen can ride 6 miles for 2 cents, 12 miles for 4 cents, 30 miles for 10 cents, and workmen receive from 25 to 30 per cent more wages for eight hours of labor than they are paid in this country for ten hours.

In Hungary, where the roads are state-owned, you can ride six miles for one cent, and since the roads were bought by the government the men's wages have doubled.

In Germany you can ride four miles for one cent on the government-owned lines. Yet wages are over 125 per cent higher than when the corporations owned them, and during the last ten years the net profits have increased 41 per cent.

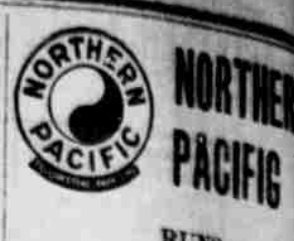
