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The historian, John Fiske, declares that all the wars which the world has ever seen can be traced directly to taxation in one form or another, and the more one studies the subject the better convinced he is that there is truth in the assertion.

The states of Iowa, Georgia and Arkansas show a larger increase in population since 1880 than does California. This fact moves the press and people of the Golden State to consider what shall be done that they may be able to keep up with the procession.

No change in the recent vote of states, as compared with 1896, was more remarkable than that in Utah. This year it gave McKinley a plurality of about 4000. In 1896 it gave Bryan a plurality of 51,000. Perhaps the benevolent attitude of Mr. McKinley toward polygamy in the Salt Lake country has given rise to hopes of similar kind treatment by the "saints" of Mormonism.

One noteworthy result of the recent election will be the retirement of South Dakota from the saloon business. The returns show conclusively that the voters think the dignity of a state is not upheld by engaging in the liquor traffic, and almost every county has given rise to hopes of similar kind treatment by the "saints" of Mormonism.

The Spokesman-Review is crying out lustily and pointedly against the pass evil. It declares the acceptance and use by public officials of free transportation is a species of bribery. And it is. Persons entertaining old-fashioned notions about right and wrong are unable to discern any moral distinction between the acceptance of a pass worth \$50 or \$100, or more, and the acceptance of that amount of money. They reason that if the attorney or agent of a litigant should give "courtesies" in the form of merchandise to jurors sitting on his case, the thing would be set down as bald faced bribery, and they can discover no difference between that reprehensible act and the bestowal of railway tickets on legislators and other public officials who must sit on matters of conflict between the carriers and the public. It is simply plain bribery on the part of the railroad company that gives the pass or plain blackmail on the part of the public official that demands the favor. This pass evil should be broken up. Here in Oregon it flourishes, with the result that the public as well as the railroad companies are suffering from the burden of it.

Is the Nicaragua canal to be built? Or will something be trumped up to delay the building of it, as has been done several times before, blinding the eyes of the people to the work of those who are opposed to the construction of the water way? The administration has full knowledge of the intent of the opposition, but it does not lift a finger to sweep it out of the way. Every congressman appears to be in favor of building it, at least, all of them declare they are, but not a thing is done. It is talk, talk, promise, promise, promise, all the time, and yet the people are patient! The special commission—and there have been several of them—is expected to present a definite report soon, favoring the Nicaragua route, and all obstacles to direct negotiations with Nicaragua and Costa Rica have vanished, and there appears no reason for further delay, but there will be delay, and more promises, just the same.

lawyer in the south of France. He served as a private soldier in the revolutionary armies, but worked himself rapidly up to the rank of general, through his great military and executive ability. He became minister of war and was made a marshal by Napoleon, although the two were personal enemies.

When, in 1810, the Swedes chose him for their crown prince, they were influenced more by his integrity and nobility of character than by his transcendent military ability.

Charles XIII. died in 1818 and Bernadotte became king of Sweden, taking the title of Charles XIV. So there reigned in this northern land a man sprung from the lowest rank of life, without one drop of noble or royal blood in his veins; a man who began his remarkable career as private in that great revolutionary army of France, which the old kings so detested and feared.

Bernadotte made a model king, and was greatly loved by the Swedes although he was never able to learn the Swedish language. He was a sincere friend of the people, as have been all the kings of his line who have succeeded him.

Bernadotte, or Charles XIV., died in 1844, and was succeeded by his son, Oscar I. Oscar was in turn succeeded in 1859 by his son Charles XV., who, dying childless in 1872, left the throne to his brother, the present king, Oscar II, grandson of Bernadotte. The last two kings have both been thorough Swedes. Every king of this line has been an honorable, able, industrious and intelligent ruler, and has held not alone the respect but also the deepest love and devotion of his subjects.

The royalty of Europe, however, does not forget that Swedish kingship is scarce a century removed from its plebeian origin, and the little kinglets and princelings are inclined to stick up their blue-blooded noses. The other royal families do not intermarry with the Bernadottes, and doubtless that is why Sweden has had such a remarkable line of kings, mainly, healthy kings, while weaklings, invalids, imbeciles, and ridiculous puppets abound elsewhere.
