THE ASSESSMENT LAWS

Changes Recommended by the
Association of Assessors and Judges.
The suggestions agreed upon by the
association of Oregon county judges and
assessors, lately in session in Portland,
embodied in the following resolutions,
which were adopted Thursday:
We recommend that all real prop-
erty be assessed by description or num-
ber, or by legal subdivisions, or by
lot and block, or by lots or blocks,
the case might require, rather than
the name of the owner or supposed
owner, and that the valuation be
based on the same only every two
years; and that the improvements on
real property be considered as part
of the same.

When errors occur in any descrip-
tion of real property, the sheriff or tax
collector shall have the power to cor-
rect the same, when satisfied of such
error.

We would further recommend that
the form of the assessment roll be
made in such a manner that it may be
used for the tax collector's roll, and
the delinquent tax sale, and that
county and city lots be put in separate
books.

We also recommend that the first
installment in January of each year be
based on the date of valuations, to be
based on all property.

We recommend that assessors be
elected for a term of four years.

We recommend that a committee of
three be appointed to draft and prepare
able assessment blanks to carry
out recommendations into effect,
and that this committee be authorized
to employ legal service, the county
judge of the several counties to pay
the same.

That the treasurer shall be collector
of taxes up to the time they become
delinquent; that the sheriff shall col-
lect the delinquent taxes.

That if the present law is not
amended it should be made so that
if for advertisement on real property
for same for delinquent taxes
it should not be made necessary.
That all taxes should become due
on payable November 1, annually,
and become delinquent on January 1,
following, and that a penalty of 1 per
cent be then added, with legal interest
thereon, after becoming delinquent.

A state board of equalization, con-
sisting of seven members to be ap-
pointed by the governor or elected by
the voters. The state to be divided
into seven districts, based on popula-
tion.

But one of the first "reforms" to be
passed by the assessors is to stop
paying on passes furnished by the rail-
road.

A REMARKABLE ACCIDENT.

A MORROW COUNTY MAN KITS DOWN ON A DOUBLE BITTED AXE.

He Was Gathering Wood in the Blue Mountains: Stuck the Axe in a Log and Fell Upon It.

Curtis F. Parker, a resident of Lex-
ington, Morrow county, while cutting
wood in the mountains near that place,
fell on an axe and died within a few
minutes from the injury received. The
Hepburn Times gives the following
particulars:

Mr. Parker, accompanied by his son
and brother, had gone to the moun-
tains Friday for a load of wood. A
tree was felled and Mr. Parker, after
trimming it, was snaking it down a
hill side with his team to where the
wagon was standing. He had stuck
the double-bitted axe into the log and
in walking by the log on the snow he
slipped, or went to sleep, and fell on
the sharp ax in a sitting position,
severing the descending aorta and
causing death almost instantly. After
falling he got to his feet and yelled
"come here!" to his son, who was a
few yards away, but before the boy
could reach him, his father had expired.

The son and brother carried him
half a mile on a stretcher to the wagon,
on the running gear of which he was
hauled five miles to the house of a
neighbor, where a hack was procured
and the corpse taken to Lexington, ar-
riving there about midnight.

Mr. Parker was born in Illinois,
February 16, 1851, and came to Oregon
in 1882, settling in the Willamette
Valley. He came to Morrow county
several months ago, and was held in
the very highest esteem by all who
knew him. He leaves a wife and eight
children.

THE SETTLERS' LOSS.

A Decision of the General Land Office in
Favor of the Corporate Interests.

The officials of the Lakeview land
office on the 19th ultimo received a
copy of the decision of Commissioner
Hermann, of the general land office,
at Washington, in the case of the state
of Oregon and the Warner Valley Stock
company vs. J. L. Morrow, et al., in
which several tracts of valuable land
in Warner valley were involved.

On February 15, 1900, the land
officials of the Lakeview land office
rendered a decision in favor of the
settlers who had settled upon this land
12 or 14 years ago, and for which they
have been in controversy ever since.

The settlers' rights.

This decision of the local land office
was the first real encouragement the
settlers had ever had, as they were
related over the result of their arduous
efforts to gain a home on these lands.

It was contended by the settlers that
while land for which the state of Ore-
gon had granted a title to McCanney
Bros. afterwards embodied in the in-
corporation which formed the Warner
Valley Stock company, as swamp land,
and which could not be such according
to their testimony, was covered by the
waters of a permanent lake in the year
1800. The case was appealed from the
Lakeview land office decision, and
after going into the testimony, com-
missioner Hermann decided that the
land was not covered by the waters of
a permanent lake as stated by wit-
nesses for the Lakeview land office, and
reversed the decision. This decision is
final and will take the homes from
many families here, and by the con-
stant expense of land suits since their
settlement in Warner.

A Lawyer's Colonel's Regret.

Colonel C. A. Cogswell expresses his
regret of the settlers losing their land;
nevertheless his vigorous aid has been
employed in their defeat and for the
victory of the Warner Valley Stock
company, of which he is a member,
and the state of Oregon, who made the
settlers' error in granting swamp land
titles for such lands. Warner valley
is practically covered with trails, and
in early days was considered unfit for
cultivation or for purposes other than
stock grazing, therefore it was an easy
matter for applicants to obtain title
to it as swamp land. Later develop-
ments, however, proved that section to
be a rich agricultural valley, hence
the attempt by intending settlers to
wrest from the grasp of monopoly a
few desirable locations for happy
homes. The decision is an important
one and will no doubt caution settlers
from investing in smuggled lands
hereafter in Oregon. Hundreds of
thousands of acres of just such land
lie in Eastern Oregon and are con-
trolled by large corporations and land
grabbers.

And why should it not be so, is
not land capitalized, monopolized and
traded as private property, although it
is just the product of any one's labor?
So long as this is done those who
"use" land will be at the mercy of
those who "own" land for speculative
purposes. There is only one way to
correct the abuse and that is to put
taxation solely upon land values and
thus drive the "capitalized" and
"monopolized" value out of it and
thus destroy the nest in which the
trust bred have birth and from which
they receive all the force behind them.
The trust will never be destroyed
until the single tax theory is a law of
the land.—Editor.

FOR AN OPEN RIVER.

Portland Seems to Have Taken Up the
Cause in Earnest.

Portland, Nov. 23.—A special meet-
ing of the trustees of the Portland
Chamber of Commerce was called to-
order this morning shortly before
eleven by the president of the cham-
ber, George Taylor, jr. The meeting
convened to discuss the matter of the
proposed Dalles-Celilo canal, and
there was a full attendance of the trust-
ees. The advisability of constructing
the canal was thoroughly discussed
and it was decided to invite E. H.
Libby, of the Lewiston Commercial
Club, to attend a special meeting of
the trustees that will be held next
Tuesday afternoon. Mr. Libby has
been invited to attend the meeting in
order that the views of an up-river
man may be secured in regard to the
construction. Any effort that is made
towards securing an appropriation
from the national congress or towards
transferring the boat railway ap-
propriation mentioned in a previous
letter, will be most effective if all
parties interested combine and work in
unison to bring about the passage of
a new bill or the repeal of the old one,
with a resolution appended to the
effect that the money be transferred to
a canal fund. The trustees of the
chamber have taken the matter up
with great enthusiasm and it is prob-
able to suppose that a decision as to
manner of procedure will be made be-
fore congress convenes on the first Mon-
day of next month.
