We have not entered upon a policy of imperialism, we were recently informed by President McKinley, but now General Miles and Corbin comes forward and express themselves as being in favor of a "colonial army, modeled after England's Indian army."

A recent address by former Mayor Abram S. Hewitt of New York has a truer ring. It was an eloquent plea for the poor, urging that great wealth involves great responsibilities and duties.

Since 1840 our national wealth has increased five times as fast as our population. Who shall say that with that wonderful increase in wealth there is not means in abundance to remove all the misery and all the evil conditions among the humble classes which at present are stains and sores on our body politic?

The rich have not even begun to do what they ought to do. Men that I almost worship for their generosity and solicitude for those that have less are not giving in proportion to their wealth and numbers of old, and men driven back to the land where they can at least have the breeze and the green grass and the sunshine and the blue of heaven to look up to.

In this an overwrought picture? We think not, it is the hard, terrible truth, and when set against it, Mr. Roosevelt's stilled lecture strikes as a discord.

If our moral leaders must speak of the poor man's envy, let their words be as pious; shots; but let them speak in the telling tones of thunder in the greedy grasping, scheming, men of multi-millions, who covet the scant earnings and scantier savings of the country's toilers.

While these movements are good, there is the objection that the campaign of education in their favor is often conducted in an exaggerated way so as to occasion something like a panic on the subject.

The one good feature of the scare manifest by these advertisements is that it will help along the education of the public mind in regard to the disease and thus help to check it in every part of the union.
