LEWIS AND CLARK FAIR.

To Be Held in Portland in 1905. Board of Trade Decides.

Portland, Jan. 17.—At a joint meeting of the Portland Board of Trade and the Manufacturers' association this afternoon it was decided to hold a fair in Portland in 1905 to celebrate the first centennial of the Lewis and Clark expedition.

A company will be incorporated at once for \$300,000 with authority to issue bonds in addition to stock. Agents will be sent to Washington, Montana, Idaho and Wyoming to lay the matter before the legislatures and ask co-operation and appropriations. The city of Portland and the state of Oregon will be asked for financial aid.

High Water.

Portland, Jan. 17.—All trains on the Southern Pacific arrived and departed on the west side tracks owing to the high water between Portland and Oregon City.

An agent, acting for Dan Stuart, has signed contracts with a builder of Carson City, Nevada, to erect an arena for a prizefight in May. The arena is to have a seating capacity of 10,000 and is to be finished by May 1.
