### SOME BIG OREGON TIMBER

Exhibit Passes Through Pendleton En-  
route to Buffalo.

Some fine specimens of Oregon  
timber passed through Pendleton yester-  
day, en route to Buffalo to be placed at  
the Pan-American exposition. Among  
this collection were a section of a  
sugar pine tree that was 22 feet high  
and seven feet in diameter and said to be  
25 years old; a three-foot section of  
Oregon fir, nine feet and six inches in  
diameter; a stick of yellow fir timber  
254 inches, 75 feet long, weighing 25  
tons; two yellow fir planks three  
inches thick, 20 inches wide and 74  
feet long; one yellow fir plank, four  
inches thick, four feet wide and 24  
feet long. There were also sections of  
trunks of maples three feet in diameter,  
one section three feet, hemlock  
four feet, white oak three feet,  
madrona two and one-half feet, and a  
section of tide land spruce 16 feet long  
and eight and one-half feet in diameter;  
this monster piece was from the  
Necanicum.

Exposition Notes.

Superintendent Doush, of the Oregon  
Pan-American exhibit, expects to have  
another car loaded for Buffalo by the  
end of the week. This car will contain  
the mineral exhibit from Southern  
Oregon and some more fruit and grain.  
It will also contain a good showing of  
Oregon building stones. Still another  
car will be loaded next week, and by  
the time this is filled Oregon's exhibit  
will be pretty well assembled.

City Attorney Long, having failed  
thus far in getting a suitable person to  
go to Victoria to talk up the 1905  
Lewis and Clark exposition, says the  
colonization committee cannot go himself,  
is figuratively speaking "up a stump."  
It is very important that the seed be  
sown in British Columbia territory

A TRIP TO THE CONCORD

A Mine Which Is Nearly All Owned by  
Penitentiary People.

James A. Howard, secretary of the  
Concord Company, returned Thursday  
night from a trip to the property. The  
Concord tunnel is 300 yards from the  
Red Boy mine in Grant county. In  
making the trip from Sumpter to the  
Red Boy a week ago, Mr. Howard had  
as a companion S. N. Farris, Jr., who  
committed suicide at Baker City  
Thursday morning. Mr. Howard states  
that Mr. Farris was a bright young  
man, wealthy and of good family.  
One of the last persons he would have  
suspected would commit suicide. His  
one mania was gambling. His father  
had died only three weeks ago at Los  
Angeles, Calif., and to him he had  
given his promise that he would  
gamble no more. He had lost \$1700  
gambling within the past week. Mr.  
Howard says it was not the loss of the  
money that led him to commit the rash  
deed, but the breaking over the fact  
that his gambling sin seemed to have  
such a hold upon him that he could  
not overcome it, and that had been  
false to the promise to his father. The  
Farris syndicate has spent \$40,000 in  
the district within the past three  
months, principally upon the Quebec
