CRUELTY TO BACHELORS.

When once a state legislature is under way and fully seized with the law making fever, there is no telling where they will bring up. Of course it is the business of lawmakers to make new laws and amend old ones to meet conditions that exist, or others that may arise, and when a man is once landed in the legislature or the senate he feels a responsibility to his constituents that nothing short of introducing a bill will satisfy.

The crowning injustice, however, developed in the legislature of Pennsylvania and was aimed at the liberties of a certain class of men designated as "old bachelors." The bill provides for an annual payment of one hundred dollars by every bachelor forty years of age, and that the fund so created shall be used for the support of aged and invalid spinsters, who have been deprived of the support of a husband.

The injustice of this attempted legislation appears on its face. It is contrary to the constitution, that respects the property of the citizen.
