Two terrible scoundrels made no walls between them as they ran away from their Pendleton homes last week and were found in Wallowa Valley. They had gone away to see what was in that world that lies outside the line described by parental authority, to learn how a boy can be "your own boss," a government and who is at war. To cover infinite innocents, that world presents a field easy to conquer. They had some vanity as to their power, a contemptuous new world, a tyro's new measures, to give them happiness. It once per could only make the innocents who are in love and soliloquies keep an entire edition the rules of control, or, at least, are supposed to do so, and who is it, if they do not? The ladies found some hard work out there in that new world, in which they went like wild Columbines on a voyage of discovery. It is necessary that one should have followed them and deserved one's actions, in order to tell what they come.

They came back for the last and one of home, the same girls, discovered because that parents' love is not an illsome thing, even though sometimes it seems to be. The old dishonorable is to recruit an amateur subject as a well-groomed knowledge and wide experience; and they found out. It is something to be proud when a mother thinks one away at night in a warm comfortable bed, kisses a tender good night, and leaves the boy to sleep in long, long hours, with "Nannie's sweet review" as a medicine to heal the little wounds and aches of a boy's day.

They found that these things will not be good long when one has not yet learned how to begin. They found out that the world regarded their new career as a joke, with a tinge of parental sympathy with it, and those who would be won over were very few boys who had wandered away. And, like the great big hand of death in the form of a Wallowa Wall of police, came down on their shoulders, and the joke was at an end. It won't hurt the sons of men. They have found out some things they knew not before. It won't, and the boys who stayed at home, if they will only learn how foolish we are because who went, and how much on earth are little lads who remain where their parents can care for them.

### WISE TO "JOLLY" BURTON.

Chairman Burton and members of the river and harbor committee are to visit Oregon soon. These men should be received in a manner favorable to impress the Columbia river again upon the leaders of their congressional memories. They should give the best attention that Oregon and Eastern Washington have to offer. The river and port of Portland, Oregon, may be the best. The influence exercised in the Columbia river valley should exert a sense of wisdom as sufficient justifications.
