**PENDLETON'S GAY CROWD**

**THE TRIP TO HEPPNER WAS GREATLY ENJOYED.**

Baseball Players, Fireman and All-Round Athletes of Pendleton Have Returned From Morrow County.

Thomas W. Ayres, Jr., Joe V. Tallman, Walter Bateson, Tom Boylen, Otto Bontcher and Lee Teutsch, known as "Pendleton's Big Half Dozen," who drove over to Heppner on Monday, June 10, to witness the baseball game and attend the fireman's tournament, managed by a streak of good luck to get back to Pendleton in safety on Thursday evening. They went to Heppner for fun and had it in large doses. They enjoyed the ball game, guessed the winner, were royally entertained, and things came their way generally.

**M. M. Wyrick Inspects His Fields and Reports.**

M. M. Wyrick, of this city, returned Thursday afternoon from an inspection of his fields of grain on Prospect place and on the home ranch in Despain gulch. Will Wyrick also returned to Pendleton. Mr. Wyrick left samples of his grain at the East Oregonian office for the inspection of farmers. He says that wheat has not been damaged in the above mentioned districts as far as he could discover, but on the contrary the outlook is excellent for a big yield. He had some fine samples of Salt Lake club from Prospect place, four grains to the bush, 10 to 12 meches to the bush. He has 500 acres of that variety. His blue stem, which he has 1300 acres on his Despain gulch farm also shows up well. His Sonora wheat is almost ready to harvest. This is a spring variety, but he sowed his 150-acre of it last winter, partly as an experiment. From the samples one would judge it to be valuable as a winter grain.

**BYE RUINED BY FROST.**

He has 70 acres of rye which he planted to reclaim some land which had been "blown out." The rye did not escape the frost like the wheat. Some of the frosted heads and some of the good ones that had escaped were brought in for inspection. Mr. Wyrick says that the 70 acres of rye has been ruined to an extent of 75 per cent.

A Trip Taken Through a Number of Wheat Fields.

L. E. Penland returned this morning from a trip of inspection through a number of the wheat fields of Umatilla county and reports that "many of the farmers are worse scared than hurt by the cold weather." He went from Pendleton up the Wild Horse to Havana station, thence north to Helix, a distance of about 20 miles. The damage to wheat along the Wild Horse is but slight, and that only on the low land. The frost apparently did its damage in spots. The greatest evidence of the work of frost was seen in a stretch of country several miles east and west and 10 or 12 miles north of Pendleton. According to his judgment the loss in no case would be more than five or six acres of wheat out of 100.
