The narratives of Genesis are not history as we understand it; they are largely mythical, that is to say, history idealized. Wherever in any literature we find ancient traditions, loved by the people and repeated for a long time before they were reduced to writing, there we find myth. This rule is without an exception. Whether these narratives take the form of poetry or prose, their mythical character is unmistakable. These ancient stories are the creation of the childhood of every people. "They represent the world seen through childhood's eyes, a world of tender poetry and of perfect trust, un-troubled by the thought of what is possible or impossible. Hence we do not see that hard and false distinction of natural and supernatural. Heaven and earth meet and blend with each other."
