Pendleton could not make a score in the ninth, so the game was over, 10 to 9, while Heppner had one inning to spare. The prettiest play of the whole tournament occurred in this game in the fourth inning. Clarence Penland knocked a hard high fly to deep center field. Shatt ran for it and took it in with his left hand.

### QUEEN VICTORIA HER MOTHER

Death-Bed Story of New York Pauper—Received Remittances.

A woman, who with almost her last breath told the story that she was the oldest daughter of Queen Victoria and the Prince Consort, is dead in New York, having expired in the German hospital, a victim of the heat and of insufficient nutrition.

The charity of a doctor who attended at her death, implicitly and who learned of her demise, her body will not be buried in Potter's field, but it will be buried this afternoon in Calvary cemetery.

The woman, who was known as Sophia Adelaide and Mrs. Kent, always asserted that as an infant she was taken from her royal mother and in her place was substituted the daughter of Prince Albert by his morganatic wife, the Countess de Reuss. Up to the time, it is said, of her coming to America, which was shortly after the death of John Brown, the queen's Highland attendant, Sophia Adelaide received remittances in Paris or wherever she might be, through the Rev. Ward Bouvie, of Coles Hill, England. When these remittances stopped and she inquired into the cause, she found that Mr. Bouvie was dead and thenceforth her remittances were paid for by John Brown's heirs, it is said.

At his death they ceased altogether. She made several ineffectual attempts to obtain a settlement and when these failed she came to this country and brought out a book which, it is said, had been suppressed in England and Germany. It contained her contentions.

### WHEAT CROP IS DAMAGED

The Farmers of Umatilla County Bring Adverse Reports.

The reports of the wheat crop of Umatilla county for the year of 1901, as brought to Pendleton on the latter days of Fourth of July week, and on Sunday and Monday of this week, are of a decidedly adverse character. Several of the best informed farmers of the county have told the East Oregonian that the crop has been damaged certainly not less than 25 per cent. This has been done by a combination of circumstances. The frosts of June 5-7 started the trouble. They left the wheat plant in a weakened condition. Then came the cold winds, blasting the grain. The wheat raised in Umatilla county in 1900 was probably 4,000,000 bushels, nearly all of which was No. 1. Included in that was a great deal of volunteer wheat, which made phenomenal yield, and spring wheat, much above the average. The volunteer wheat this year will be scarcely any crop.

Dr. W. R. Campbell's Report.

The most pronounced report of crop damage was brought to Pendleton this morning by Dr. W. R. Campbell, who resides in the Cold Spring country, 18 miles northwest of Pendleton. He has been examining fields of wheat for the Scotch company and says that the crops north of Pendleton have been damaged 50 per cent. "Not only will the yield be less, but the wheat harvested will be of low grade," said Mr. Campbell. "There won't be 500,000 bushels of No. 1 wheat raised in Umatilla county this year. There won't be a single field of No. 1 wheat in the Cold Spring country." Those are rather strong expressions, but the doctor raises a great deal of wheat and claims to be a careful observer of matters pertaining to crops, and is consequently entitled to consideration as a statistician.

Western Slopes Damaged.

The greatest damage to wheat is on the western slopes. The cold winds did the damage, rather than the frosts, is the general opinion.
