TWO MEN HELD UP BY TWO

J. F. CLEMMER AND CON REAGAN WERE THE VICTIMS.

The Robbery Occurred at 10 o'clock on the Night of Tuesday, July 16, in East Pendleton.

A highway robbery occurred on the long bridge across the Umatilla river in East Pendleton at 10 o'clock on the night of Tuesday, July 16. The victims were J. F. Clemmer, foreman of C. B. Wade's stock farm, and Con Reagan, who has charge of the famous Hackney stallion owned by Mr. Wade. The night was dark as the two men were coming in to Pendleton, when at the point above mentioned they were held up by two men and compelled to disgorge one watch each as well as all the small change both had in their possession, amounting to a few dollars.

The Officers Notified.

Immediately upon arrival in town both the county and city officials were notified. Owing to the circumstances under which the robbery was committed neither Mr. Clemmer nor Mr. Reagan was able to get a good view of the two highwaymen, and consequently could not give a description of them that would be of much value to the officers in apprehending them.

Toughs in Town.

At this season of the year, and this particular year, there are numerous tough-looking individuals in the city. Then the circus is here, too, and with such a show there are frequently numerous rough hangers-on who keep the officers on the qui vive to prevent the commission of crime. There is but slight chance of catching these highwaymen, but everyone in town is notified to be careful and keep houses well barricaded to prevent any more robberies.

MIGHT HAVE BEEN WORSE

A Wild Runaway Down Pendleton's Crowded Main Street.

A team belonging to VanOradall & Monie started at the O. R. & N. depot between 11 and 12 o'clock this Wednesday forenoon, and ran for three blocks down Pendleton's Main street, the side walk of which were crowded with people in town to see Sells & Gray's circus. Walter Parrazo had charge of the team, but was not on the wagon when the team started. At the crossing at Alta street the young man tried to intimidate the horses and induce them to stop. It was useless. He was struck by the southeast corner of the wagon, which protruded in his direction and knocked down. The team continued in their wild career. When near Joe Eli's harness and saddlery store the team undertook to leave the street and get out onto the sidewalk. Frank Whiteker, a stranger from the Willamette valley, grabbed the lead horse by the bridle and brought the whole outfit to a standstill before anyone had been run over.

The right hind wheel was broken on the wagon, together with the axle to which it was attached, and the tongue was broken off and the wagon otherwise wrecked.

That no person was injured was a matter of decided good luck. This is the severest time that this team has run away, and it might be advisable to put bottles on the horses until they can learn to behave themselves.

WILL FIGHT FRIDAY NIGHT.

Sports Getting Ready for the Irwin-Cole Go at Portland.

Portland, July 17.—The big championship glove contest between Toby Irwin, the crack San Francisco lightweight pugilist, and Willie Cole of Sacramento, which will take place at the exposition building in this city on Friday night, the 19th inst., promises to be the greatest pugilistic card ever offered in the Pacific Northwest. Both boys are in the pink of condition and both are confident of winning. Irwin has been trained by his manager, Biddy Bishop, at the Mikado hotel, while Cole has prepared at the Merchants', under the instruction of Theo. Van Buskirk. Both pugilists have agreed to weigh in at 130 pounds. A large delegation of sporting men, headed by Dave Blake, have arrived from Tacoma to see the contest.

Ed Simms is in town from Portland with a party of friends, while Bob Boyce, the genial sporting editor of the Seattle Times, has come over to see the mill, with a big party of sporting men. Orders for tickets have been received from Astoria, Baker City, Eugene, Pendleton, Salem, The Dalles and different neighboring cities. Altogether it should be one of the largest gatherings of sporting men ever seen in Portland.

PROTECTION FROM HIMSELF.

Man in Walla Walla Hospital in Pitiable Condition.

It is not often a man has to go to a hospital because he cannot refrain from hitting himself, but there is a patient at the Walla Walla hospital now of whose condition this is a feature. Charles Richards is his name, and he has been in the hospital since the day of his leg at the knee was performed some time ago.

Since then nervous agitation of the amputated limb has set in, and the unfortunate man was forced to bed once more. When he sleeps the stump of the amputated limb will suddenly fly up and strike him a hard blow in the stomach, and no influence will keep it from jumping up constantly and keeping in a perpetual state of agitation. It is a case that rarely comes to the notice of physicians in an aggravated form, and strange as it may seem, a second amputation will likely be necessary before the jerking and their self-punishment will cease.

QUIDA STRONGLY PROTESTS.

Treatment of Mrs. Cronwright for Resisting the Boer Cause.

Mrs. Louise de la Rampe (Quida) has a long letter in the Daily News protesting against the treatment administered by the British in South Africa to Mrs. Cronwright.

"It is, I think, entirely true that Mrs. Oliver Schreiner has been transported to a strange place and imprisoned within a fence of wire netting, which is protected by armed sentinels stationed at intervals, with orders to fire upon anyone attempting to get through the netting to escape. In this place she lives alone, with her dog, in one small room, for which she pays, cooking for herself, and compelled to remain all night without any kind of light. Her husband is refused by the British authorities permission to visit her, although her brother is a former premier of Cape Colony. What is her offense? Merely to have opposed the cause of the Boers during the war. Is it tolerable that for this alone she should be subjected to the indignity of isolation and be carried away from all she loves?"

The \$10,000 covers the expenses of the preliminary hearing and the trial at the fall term of court.
