JUDGE BRENTS' OPINION.

Matters are being brought to a focus in Walla Walla, and also for the state of Washington, in the Sunday closing cases that have attracted considerable attention throughout the northwest. Judge Brents rules as to the constitutionality of the statute requiring the closing of all places of business excepting hotels, restaurants and drug stores for the sale of medicines.

As to the constitutionality of the statute in question, the supreme court, of course, must decide strictly according to the principles that govern courts of appeal. If it be consistent with the state's organic law, the statute will stand. If not, then it will be declared invalid.

But, as to the quesiton of whether such a statute should have been enacted, it is competent for any American citizen to express an opinion. Many of those who would prefer that Sunday be observed will coincide with the view that such a law is unjust, that no portion of the commonwealth represented by legislators has the right to say that John Jones shall not sell goods on Sunday or play innocent games or do anything that in itself is not wrong.
