A Comparison Instituted. Without going into wearying details, a comparison between Pendleton and other towns of the country shows that this is a very healthy place in which to live. The death rate here is 11.5 to the thousand per annum, but slightly more than 10 per thousand, and close to the lowest averages established by the most careful investigation throughout the United States. In New York, where latest scientific knowledge has been applied the annual mortality rate per 1000 of population is 13, or 1,5 higher than that of this town.

Dr. Cole has made such a report to the surgeon general of the United States recently, and has in so doing had occasion to give some attention to the matter under consideration.




