OPINION REGARDING A PLOT

Secretary Root Believes Czolgosz Was Not in a Conspiracy.

Washington, Sept. 18.—Secretary Root, who has been directing the effort to apprehend all persons who may be connected in any way with the attempt on the life of the president, described the work of the secret service bureau and of the bureau of information of the war department, which exercises, in a military sense, the same functions as the secret service branch of the treasury.

It is understood that Mr. Root's report convinced members of the cabinet that there was no conspiracy to take the life of the president. The secre-tary of war told his associates that the investigations of the two detective bu-reaus of the national government, act-ing in conjunction with the police departments of all cities where the anarchists had any organization, had not been fully completed, but that he had received information enough to justify the statement that so far there was no positive informa-tion of criminality on the part of any one except the Anarchist Czolgosz.
