

Mother Stanislaus Provincial has returned to Pendleton after a seven weeks' stay at Philadelphia and intermediate points. She went east to confer with the General Count of st. Francis in regard to the projected hospital. The council decided to leave the matter entirely in the hands of She said today Mother Stanislaus. that between \$10,000 and \$15000 would necessary for the erection of the building and the necessary furnishings. The foundations will be put in or at least started before the first of the year. It is probable that nothing further will be done until the opening of the spring for it is feared that the frost will inpair the walls which will be of brick. The mother will go to Portland tonight and during her stay she will visit Archbishop Christie, to hear his opinion on the project.

While returning from Philadelphia, Mother Stanislans visited missions at Rawlins, Wyoming: Fort Stevens Baker City and La Grande. To get to Fort Stevens, she was obliged to ride 175 miles by stage.
