The whole country is commending the course of the Buffalo authorities in the Czologsz case. The great danger was that the murderer should be permitted to gratify his insane vanity speeches and interviews and thus hate-fully stir other minds like his own. But he was kept in close confinement and beyond the reach of newspaper re-porters and hysterical persons, and he has been tried with all the despatch consistent with justice. 
