SUNDAY SCHOOL CENSUS

CHURCHES SOON WILL

CANVASS ENTIRE TOWN Plan Formed to Go Over the City by Districts.

The churches of Pendleton have combined in a plan for the furtherance of Sunday school work among all classes of people. Mrs. S. A. Lowell, secretary of the county Sunday school association, is an interested worker and is at the head of the movement to divide the city into districts so that the plan may be more easily carried out. The division has been carefully made and there are seventeen districts in all. The pastor of each church has been asked to appoint a committee of four persons from among his congregation for the purpose of taking a Sunday school census from the various districts. The committees will be iled together and each person will given a territory in which to work. A canvass will be made from house to house and a record made of the name and residence of the family, the number who are church members, who attend Sunday school, or who are in the home department of the Sunday school, and the church to which they belong or prefer to attend. The record will be segregated with reference to the matter denomination, and copies will be given to the pasters of the various churches In this way every man coman and child in Pendleton wil ome directly under the notice of the churches, and it will greatly aid the advancement of Christian work. Two years ago a similar plan was

adopted, but the census was not atilized to a full extent and did not prove entirely successful. who are most interested in the work this year say that it shall not fail through a lack of work. method by which the churches car work in harmony and not conflict with one another in their different

As soon as all the committees are appointed the members will be given their instructions in a meeting for that purpose and the canvas will be commenced. It has been announced that the Sunday school convention. will be held on Jan. 16 and 17. Judson, industrial agent of the O. R. & N., met with favor among the members of the local business community, and the agitation of the matter led to a meeting being called last even-ing at the Chamber of Commerce rooms but interest displayed fell short of the requirements to fittingly carry out the proposition.

The location of La Grande and Pen-

dieton, both cities being centra points of heavy grain and agricul-tural interests, places the growers and merchants in position to profit-ably hold sales days, as a good portion of the products of the adjacent sections are a drug on the markets. Another point made was the request of Mr. Judson that a commit tee be appointed, whose duty would be to contract with the farrmers of outlying districts for stuff for the bottles for \$5, express prepaid.


