GENERAL NEWS.

Miss Helen Gould gave \$25,000 to Rutgers College.

Bank robbers at Campellsville, Ind., secured between \$12,000 and \$15,000.

Longbaugh, the suspected Wagner train robber, will be prosecuted at St. Louis for forgery.

The annual convention of the National Prison Association began a five-days' session at Kansas City.

The condition of the German empress is serious. She may be taken to Austria on the Adriatic.

Admiral Cromwell, commanding the European squadron, arrived at Genoa yesterday on his flagship, the Chicago.

The Glasgow exhibition came to a close last night. The total attendance was 11,496,622, and the net profit is \$80,000.

The election last Tuesday will not affect the political complexion of the United States senate, which will convene in December.

The battleship Iowa will be assigned as the flagship of Rear-Admiral Crowninshield when that officer takes command of the European station.

It is now well understood among those who have conferred with the president, that he will not recommend any tariff legislation at this session.

A severe earthquake was felt at Brescia, Italy. The inhabitants were panic-stricken and fled to the streets. A number of buildings were damaged.

The Great Northern is preparing to investigate the possibility of utilizing Snoqualmie Falls, the greatest scenic attraction in the state of Washington, for polling all of its trains between Seattle and the summit of the Cascade range.

English newspapers welcome the appointment of Yuan Shih Kai as the viceroy of Chi Li. He is credited with being anti-Russian, and is confidently expected to prove a great improvement on his predecessor from a British point of view.

A new \$50,000,000 steel corporation is being formed for the purpose of uniting in one powerful combination the slate mills of the country. Ten or more plants, including Pennsylvania companies that are now doing a large business, are to be absorbed by the new concern.

The president has appointed Geo. W. Burrows postmaster at Fort Worth, Texas; Anna Durham, at Clarksdale, Miss.; Floy Hinds, at Decatur, Ala.; and Henry Harris, at Union Springs, Ala. In each case he disregarded the recommendations of the state republican organization because the organization candidates were found not to meet all requirements.

LEAVENWORTH, Nov. 11.—A report

from Alma says the posse near that

place had a running fight with two

escaped convicts last night. The con-

victs stole two horses and escaped.

The chase after the convicts who cap-

tured the sheriff, cook, and his deputy

and almost killed the former. Wor-

cester continues today unabated, but

with great caution, as the convicts

are well armed and desperate.

Worcester may die as the result of

the injuries. The posse are chasing

the convicts near Manhattan, Garnett,

and Lawrence.

ONE FATAL SHOT.

KANSAS CITY, Nov. 11.—Warren Mc-

Laughley reports from Leavenworth

that Lawrence Lewis, white, the thir-

teenth of the escaped convicts to be

taken, was arrested at Topeka, Kan.

He was shot in the back and fatally

wounded. Two others are said to

have been wounded in a fight with

officers between Topeka and Leaven-

worth.
