

The mayor or common council have no right to take money out of the pockets of the tax-payers of the city to improve streets adjoining or abutting on Main and Court street property. Under the city charter, it became the duty of every property holder to keep in repair all streets abutting on his property, according to the instructions of the common Live and dressed goese, ducks, council, out of his own pocket. "I have made a rough estimate of what asphalt paving would cost, and and that from the bridge to the O. R. & N. depot it would cost \$21,000. and from Main to College (Byer's mill) the cost would be \$15,000. s a total of \$36,000, and the total rev enue derived from all sources to be used for running the city is \$7000 per annum. It takes \$6050 out of this to pay the interest on its indebtedness, leaving only \$950 on which to run the city a whole year. If anybody thinks that Pendleton can be paved, besides, we would like to have them show us how.
