#### GENERAL NEWS

The United States training ship Alliance arrived in Norfolk, Va., from a foreign cruise. The 500 apprentices on board are reported well.

The Provenir of Cartagena under date of December 8, contains a strong article against the conduct of the Panama Railroad company during the recent isthmian events.

The jury in the case of Mrs. Lola Ida Henry Bonine, charged with the murder of James Ayres, Jr., in the Kenmore hotel, on the night of May 13, returned a verdict of not guilty.

A movement is taking shape among the export and import houses engaged in trade with China to secure more liberal treatment for Chinese merchants and others visiting this country.

In the British empire out of a population of nearly 400,000,000, about 48,800,000, or less than one-eighth, are of British birth or descent, nearly 400 are non-British white men, and the colored race number 345,000.

Representative Robinson, of Indiana, introduced two measures designed to secure the extradition of ex-Governor Taylor, of Kentucky, from Indiana, where he is said to be sojourning, to Kentucky from Indiana, where he is wanted in connection with the Goebel tragedy.

Laura Bullon, the female companion of Ben Kilpatrick, the Montana train robber suspect, who was yesterday convicted of having in his possession forged National bank notes, was sentenced by United States District Judge Adams to five years' imprisonment in the federal prison at Leavenworth, Kan.

#### PACIFIC NORTHWEST NEWS

The Portland Elks attended the Synagogue in a body. The services were of special interest.

Mrs. Mary Etta Skaffe, widow of John Skaffe, died in Salem Sunday, aged 65 years. Deceased had resided in Marion county since 1853.

The Portland city jail has sheltered on an average of 40 hobos and vagrants for the past two months, although 25 would crowd the dingy quarters.

Mrs. Ellen Thielson died suddenly in Portland at 4:30 o'clock at the home of her son, Horace W. Thielson, 66 North Twenty-first street. She was in her usual good health in the morning.

Victor Merrien, a French sailor, who had been confined in the city jail Portland, since November 21, without authority of law, was released from custody by Judge Cleland on a writ of habeas corpus.

A meeting of Portland lovers of roses, which was held to organize a rose club, was one of the best attended of any of a purely public spirited meeting that has been held in Portland for many days.

The Fulton hold-up artist has returned from his trip of profit and pleasure into Clackamas county, and introduced himself to Road Supervisor E. A. Moses, on the Marquam hill road, leading from Sixth street.

A. B. Frame, of Portland, will present to the Baker City council through his attorneys, Olmstead & Miller, a petition for a franchise to furnish electric light and power to the city and residents of Baker City, for a period of 30 years.

Workmen started grading for the new railroad to be built by the Klamath Lake Railroad company from Laird station on the Southern Pacific railroad, two miles south of Klamath river, in Siskiyou county, to Pokegama, in Klamath county, near the California boundary line.

John Roppel was shot at his home near Hubbard by Thurston Grimm, and died from the effects of his wound. Both men are farmers and Grimm is a life-long resident of Marion county. Grimm came to Salem immediately after the shooting and surrendered himself to the sheriff.

## MANY TO BE KILLED

### THE BIG DRIVE OF RABBITS AT BUTTER CREEK

Arrangements Complete for the Event that is Expected to Attract Many People.

December 29 is the date set for the big rabbit drive planned to take place at the mouth of Butter creek, and much interest is being manifested. The large corral is now complete, with wings extending out one-half mile in length, into which the unsuspecting rabbits will be driven and then slaughtered.

A large crowd will go from here, both ladies and gentlemen, and arrangements have been made to entertain the ladies, who will be allowed to participate in the drive, if they like. The crowd will go from here on the regular morning train, which will stop near the Butter creek bridge where the drive will start about 11 o'clock.

In addition to those who will go from here and the residents of the neighborhood for miles around, a special train will be run from Heppner, from where 100 or more people are going to take part in the sport.

After the corral was finished, several men concluded to test it to see if it was capable of holding the rabbits which would be driven in. They formed a small drive, with only a half dozen people and corralled 250, proving that the enclosure was perfectly capable of withstanding the efforts of the frightened animals to escape.

A small corral will be attached to the larger one, into which some of the rabbits will be driven, caught alive, and brought here by the Pendleton Gun Club, who will have a live rabbit shoot on the hill the day following.

Every convenience will be arranged for those who attend. A lunch counter with ample refreshments will be provided, and those in the lead of the project give their assurance of a grand time for those who take in the sport. J. F. Rogers has the arrangements in charge, and will be the leader of the drive.

It is expected that the O. R. & N. Co. will give special rates for the occasion, which will be announced later.

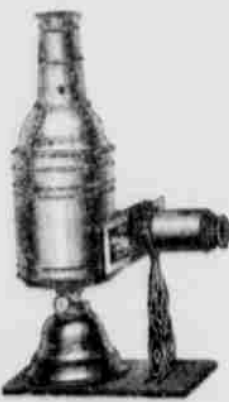

### INDIANS FEAR TO TAKE OUT THEIR PATENTS

Reason is that they think it will Compel them to Pay Taxes—Want to go to Washington.

Paul Showaway and other influential Indians on the Umatilla reservation have thus far refused to take their patents from Agent Wilkins, and they therefore lie out there in the safe of the agent, excepting in the case of a few who took them when sent from Washington a year or two ago.

The reason the Indians do not take the patents is that they fear that it will compel them to pay taxes to the state and county, which at present they do not.

The patents referred are not final, of course, but are the instruments issued from the federal land office at Washington as evidence of the individual's right to obtain final patents when the 25 years shall have elapsed from the time in 1891 when the allotments in severalty were made. These tentative documents are really patents by the federal government to the government, as trustees, and do not alter the status of the lands, nor hasten the coming of the final title to the allottees. It will be yet fifteen years before the lands will be the Indians' in fee simple.

#### Another Washington Jaunt.

Several matters are needing attention, think the leading Indians, hence they expect soon to make a journey to the national capital. There, they will, as upon former occasions, meet "The Great Father," although our latter-day Indians are deplorably lacking in the romantic element, and speak of the president as the president. They will visit the interior department, and will see to their satisfaction that all is well with their affairs. They may ask the department for the distribution of their funds, which are held there for future payment.

#### WORK ON THE 'PHONE LINE.

Butter Creekers Soon Will Have Wire Connection With the World.

Work on the Butter creek telephone line is now at a standstill, owing to the non-arrival of telephone poles. However, the promoters of this line do not think this will last long and hope to resume work again as soon as the poles arrive, which are expected every day. Already one carload, consisting of 250 poles, have been set out from Echo, and holes have been dug for the reception of many more. No wire has yet been stretched, but this will begin as soon as the work gets under headway again, so that the contractors for setting the poles can keep out of the linemen's way.
