But, if one will look at the matter in the light of the in dustrial demands of the valley, h will be compelled to mimit that the improvement of Yaquina Bay is jus as much a local necessity for a very riel region of Oregon as the improve ment of the Columbia river is for that which we call the Inland Empire.

The Road Built in 1885.

The Corvallie & Eastern is a road that was built in 1882 by William Hogue; who lives in San Francisco and who was compelled to allow the system to go at forced sale a few years ago. A. B. Hammond, who built the Astoria road, bought it. It Is believed here that it was bought for the Southern Pacific company and that it is controlled in the interest at that big system.

As a result of this policy, the road is now leading an existence that sug geats early demise, or continuance during the coming years with the minimum of railroad virility. There s nothing of progress evinced in the management, and the company apparently is content to permit the coun try dependent upon it to go without the service it should give.
