MAYOR'S CHARGE

OBJECTS TO HEATHMAN AS CITY MARSHAL.

Council Five to One in Favor of Heathman—J. E. Beam Re-elected Recorder—P. H. Fee, Street Commissioner—Charles H. Carter, City Attorney.

The first meeting of the council, elected by vote of the residents of Pendleton at their annual election in December, with the new mayor, T. G. Hailey, in the chair, met in the council chamber Thursday night. Ex-Mayor F. W. Vineet was present and when Mayor Hailey was ready to call the meeting to order, he asked him if he had anything to say. He replied that he had been talking to the council for the last four years and he thought they would not care to hear from him. Then Mayor Hailey called the council to order and in a few well chosen words outlined the work he had planned and intended to carry out during his term of office. He charged the police department with being run corruptly, and then remarked briefly about the financial condition of the city, recommending that the council be conservative in the matter of expenditures during the coming year.

The Marshal Question.
After his address and some routine business was gotten rid of, the question of city marshal came up and it was moved and seconded that ballots be prepared. Out of the seven councilmen present, J. M. Heathman received six votes, there being one for Ben Wells. The votes were read off by Councilman Johnson, but the mayor refused to accept the decision of the council. Here he again said that the head of the police department had not run the business legitimately, and again suggested that a committee be appointed to investigate. This was agreed to and then the mayor appointed Councilmen Fraser, Johnson and Sommerville to act on this committee and report at the next meeting. In the meantime Marshal Heathman will continue the duties of chief of police.

J. E. Beam Recorder.
Judge Beam was then placed in nomination to succeed himself as recorder and received the unanimous vote and the election was approved by the mayor.
P. H. Fee, street commissioner; Charles H. Carter, city attorney; Dr. G. W. Cole, city physician, succeeded themselves by unanimous vote.
An ordinance was presented and read for the first time providing that hereafter no person shall be accepted as surety on any bond or undertaking made payable to the city of Pendleton, unless such person shall be a resident freeholder in the state of Oregon, equal in value to twice the amount of the undertaking or bond in which he is surety, over and above his debts and liabilities and exclusive of his property exempt from execution. But nothing contained herein shall be held to prevent any incorporated surety company from becoming surety upon any such undertaking, or bond, whether it owns real property or not. This was ordered read the second time, approved by the council and received the signature of the mayor.
The report of the fire chief, H. J. Stillman, was read and placed on file. Councilman Clouton was unanimously elected to act as chairman in the absence of the mayor.
The councilmen present were: Clouton, Hartman, Johnson, Switzer, Frazier, Sommerville, Dickson; Wells being absent. This council is the same as the old, each having succeeded Fraser, Sommerville, Dickson, Wells and Rosevelt, retired.

REPORT OF FIRE CHIEF.

Bells on the Hose Cart Houses Are Hung Too Close to Ground.

The chief of the fire department, H. J. Stillman, in his annual report presented last evening to the city council, says: "The district alarm bells, as now hung, are inefficient. On account of their being too close to the ground alarms cannot be heard but a short distance. As a remedy for this defect I would ask that you have the bell towers on hose houses 3, 4, 5 and 6, raised so that the bell would hang at least 18 feet above the roof of the house."

"Much valuable property in the city is now practically without any fire protection, being out of reach of the present water system, and I would respectfully urge upon you the necessity of extending the water mains in both east and westerly directions at the earliest time consistent with the city's finances."
"While at present the city is perhaps unable to install a chemical engine, if it could do so, it is my opinion that it would add more to the general efficiency of the fire department than any one thing that could happen to it; especially would it be of benefit to those portions of the city that are out of reach of the water system. During the past year the damage from water has been as great as from fire, which, in most cases, would have been reduced to a minimum, from both causes, had a chemical engine been used. The Carter, Cohen, Schemp and woolen mill fires will justify the foregoing statement."
