**COMMERCIAL - TRADE**  
**WHEAT SELLS FOR**  
 50 1/2 CENTS A BUSHEL.  
 Highest Mark Reached this Year in Pendleton.  
 Wheat is quoted today in Pendleton at 50 1/2 cents per bushel, which is the highest mark it has reached since the 1901 crop was harvested. There is also an upward tendency in the market caused by the extra demand for flour which is coming from the Orient and local dealers think the price will continue strong and possibly go several cents higher during the next few days.  
 Not much wheat has moved in the county for a month past, and the total amount for the whole of last week is estimated at 25,000 or 30,000 bushels. This was sold at an average price of fifty cents net.  
 Local buyers say that out of the 500,000 bushels of wheat grown in Umatilla county last year, there is probably 600,000 bushels yet in the hands of the farmers. This, if turned loose at the prevailing price, would put over \$300,000 into the hands of the farmers.  
**FOR COLUMBIA GEORGE**  
**AND TOY TOY, IN PRISON.**  
 An Appeal May Be Taken to the Federal Supreme Court.  
 Colonel William Parsons, leading counsel in the case of Columbia George and Toy Toy, in speaking of them and the case, stated that it had not yet been decided whether or not to appeal them to the supreme court of the United States, but that unless an appeal was taken, Judge Hellingger, of the federal court would be asked to commute sentence.  
 In case of an appeal and it being sustained, a new trial might be ordered and the accused possibly found guilty of murder in the first degree and again sentenced to hang.  
 "It is a debatable question in my mind," said Mr. Parsons, "whether it would not be well to allow the present verdict to stand and not try to disturb them with a new trial, as it might prove disastrous to them."

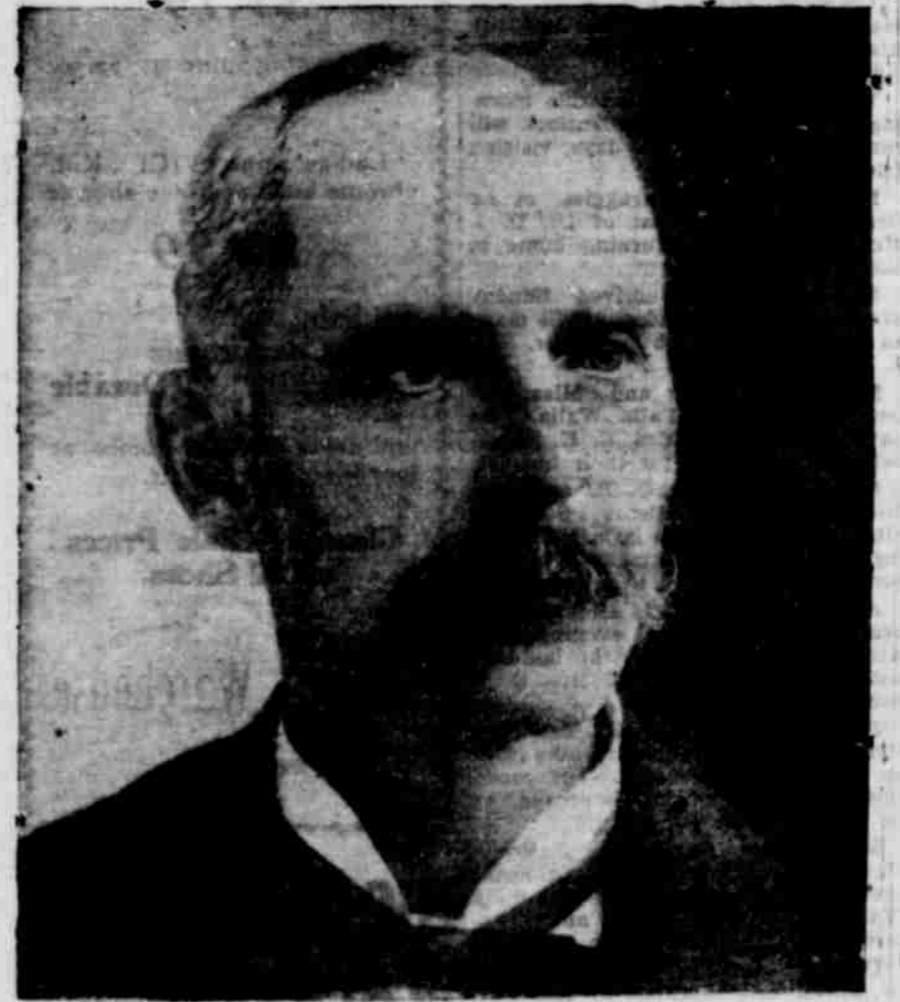
