### GENERAL NEWS

In New York a bill was introduced amending the penal code so as to make an attempt on the life of the president of the United States or on the governor of New York treason.

The condition of Lord Pauncefoot, the British ambassador, remains unchanged. He is still confined to the house as the result of an acute and prolonged attack of rheumatic gout.

Admiral and Mrs. Dewey left for Palm Beach, Fla. The length of the stay there is indefinite, as the trip is undertaken for the benefit of Mrs. Dewey's health. They are accompanied only by a maid and valet.

It is generally understood that the transcontinental railroad interests are behind the movement in favor of the Panama route. Men who have been particularly opposed to any canal now favor the Panama route.

State superintendent of elections John McCullagh, of New York, said that he had discovered what he believed was a big colonization scheme to be worked in the special election of a congressman from the Seventh Congressional district. He said he did not know in whose interest the reported colonization had been made.

The Odessa correspondent of the Daily Express says that it is reported that a strong trans-Atlantic corporation is being formed which proposes to buy up all the principal Russian tobacco manufacturing, and that it is seriously doubted whether M. De Witte, the Russian Minister of Finance, will accord his assent to such sales.

An endowment of \$1,000,000 has been given by Mr. and Mrs. Harold McCormick, of Chicago, to found a medical institution which will be known as the Memorial Institute for Infectious Diseases, as a tribute to the memory of their little son, John Rockefeller McCormick, who died of scarlet fever a year ago. At present, provision has been made only for experimental work covering a period of five years.

### PACIFIC NORTHWEST NEWS

The directors of the Portland baseball club met at the commercial club for the purpose of electing a captain for the 1902 baseball team. The man selected for the position is Samuel Vignea, catcher of last year's team.

Representative Jones filed with President Roosevelt a strong recommendation of Millard T. Harrison for appointment as postmaster of Spokane, which recommendation was concurred in by Senator Foster and Representative Cushman.

"Superior quality and honest weights" was the prominent thought in the discussion of the dairy interests at the opening session of the farmers' congress at Salem. Every speaker emphasized this essential of success in butter making.

The secretary of the interior sent to congress an agreement with the Grand Ronde Indians of Oregon, whereby they cede to the United States the surplus lands of their reservation, aggregating 25,000 acres for which the government agrees to pay \$25,500.

The steamer Dispatch which picked up the survivors of the Walla Walla disaster, arrived in Seattle, and Captain Victor Johnson gave a vivid account of the work of the rescue. Of his own great service in saving the lives of so many he would talk but little. He expressed strong indignation at the actions of some of the Walla Walla's crew.

The supreme court decided the Portland Police Commissioners' case in favor of the commissioners. Chief Justice Bean dissented. This was the suit brought by Charles Venable, who was dismissed from the police force. The lower court decided that he had been illegally dismissed, but the higher tribunal reverses Judge Sears, Cleland and George, and holds that the board of police commissioners did not exceed its powers.
