THE FREEWATER ELECTION FOR INCORPORATION.

People Will Vote in Couple of Weeks on Question of Becoming a City.

The residents of Freewater are to have the privilege of voting on the question of incorporating. The date set for this election is February 3, 1902, and at the same time municipal officers will be elected to serve the people of the town in case those in favor of incorporating win out and every indication points to an easy victory for them.

Fifty-four legal voters of the place out of 60 have signed the petition in favor of incorporating, and it was on the strength of this petition that the county court Saturday set the date for election to decide the question.

The contest over incorporation has been rather a lively one, as the few who opposed the move have brought all their force and influence to bear to thwart the proposition. Saturday it was announced that the court would act on the question and a strong delegation representing both sides presented themselves to the court to lay before it their approval or objections.

The opposition was headed by A. M. Elam and William Lloyd, who own property in Freewater and gave as their principal excuse that if incorporated it would necessarily increase their taxes. Mr. Lloyd also stated that he did not want his property cut up into streets, as would be done in case the town was incorporated, and voted along city lines.

J. S. Vinson, William Johnson, J. W. Arnold, S. H. Christiansen and A. L. Peterson were the defendants of the cause of incorporation. They argued that they want to do business under a city charter, partly for the reason that at the present time they have no government and cannot enforce law and order without "hiring an officer to come down from Milton to do it."

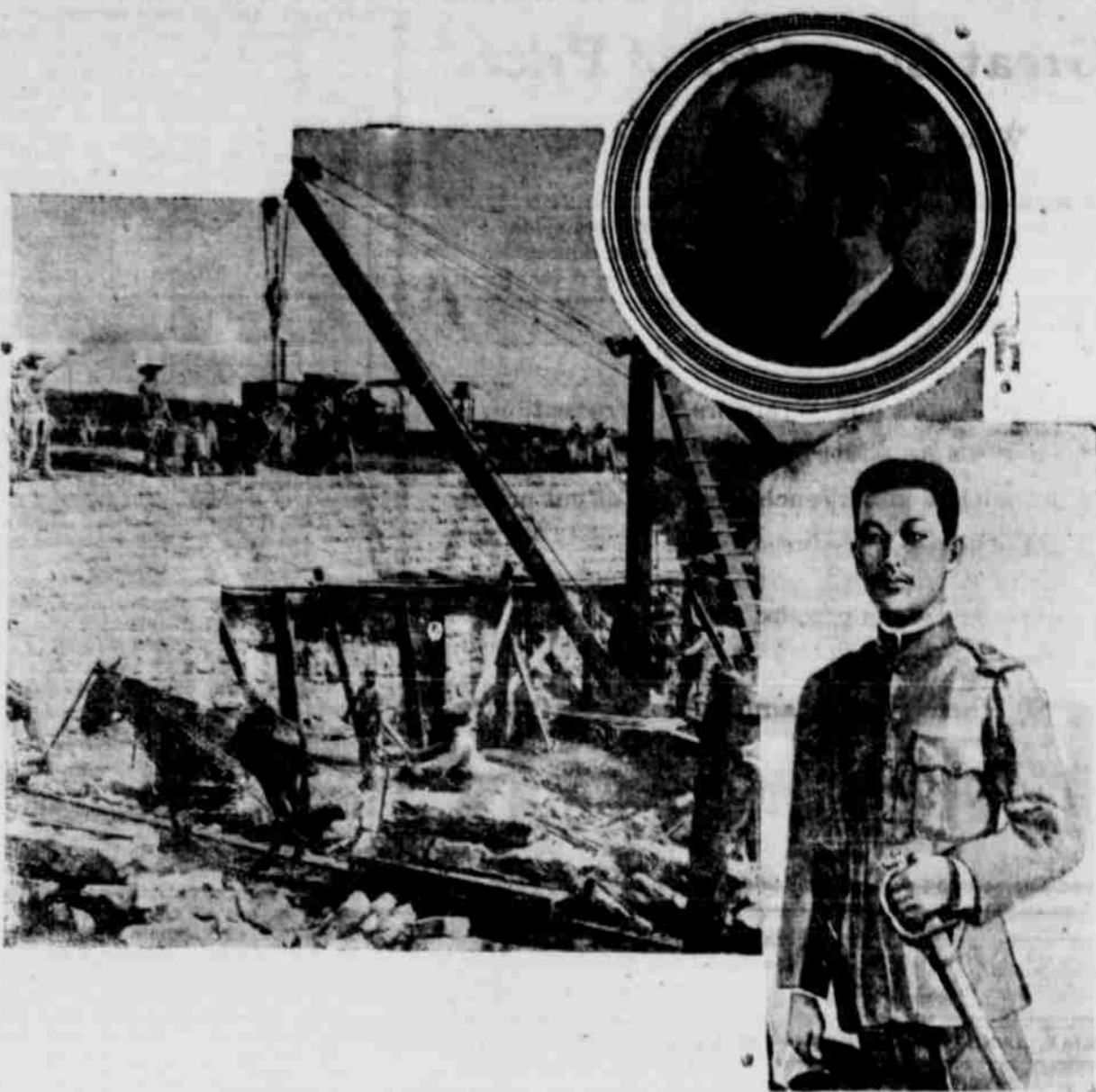

Why Nicaraguan Route.

Professor Emory R. Johnson, of the University of Pennsylvania, who has been appointed by the late president as the commercial expert upon the Nicaragua canal commission, briefly described in a recent address, the reason his commission selected the Nicaragua route, and discarded the Panama and Darien routes. The canal route through the isthmus of Darien, Professor Johnson said, the commis-

sion found too costly and impracticable, as tunnels would have to be constructed, and none large enough for the largest vessels could be properly ventilated; and even if it were possible, the cost of construction would be too great.

As between the Panama and Nicaragua routes, the latter was selected by the commission, the expert said, because it entails less work to complete, has fewer engineering difficulties to be overcome, costs considerably less, and can be completed in much shorter time. On the contrary

it is longer than the Panama route, Pacific coast commerce, but it would have more locks, is not so straight, and calls for concessions which the government must obtain from the Costa Rican and Nicaraguan governments. By acquiring the Panama route, the construction would cost about \$45,000,000 less than the Nicaraguan, but the difference would be made up in providing the construction. The Nicaraguan canal would require about four years to complete, while the Panama canal would take ten. The former would be shorter by one day for Atlantic and Asiatic trade.
